

# How to Get to Parliament House

The NSW Parliament building is located in Macquarie Street, closer to Hyde Park than Circular Quay and between the State Library and Sydney Hospital.

## By Train

The nearest train stations are Martin Place (Eastern Suburbs Line) and St James (City Circle and Airport lines). If travelling via Central Station, either from other metropolitan stations or from non-metropolitan areas, it may be necessary to change trains at Central to reach Martin Place or St James. Check the State Rail website (<http://www.cityrail.info>) or information boards at Central for details.

## Bus Travel

Buses run in Macquarie, Elizabeth and Castlereagh Streets. Route numbers 200, 308, 309, 310, 324, 325, 326, 327, 333, 339, 343, 373, 374, 376, 377, 380, 389, 391, 392, 394, 396, 397 and 399 service the area. Alternatively walk from Queen Victoria Building terminus or other city services.

## By Car

Car parking is not available at Parliament House. Sydney City Council car parks are located at **Cook and Phillip Parks** (access via Cathedral Street off St Marys Road)); and **The Domain** (access via St Marys Road). A privately operated car park is available at **Sydney Hospital** next door to Parliament House (access via Hospital Road). All parking in Sydney city is expensive.

## From Sydney Airport ([www.sydneyairport.com.au/SACL/default.htm](http://www.sydneyairport.com.au/SACL/default.htm))

Most flights from non-metropolitan NSW arrive at Terminal 2, however some Qantas Flights (with flight numbers from QF400-1599) will arrive at Terminal 3. The best ways of getting to Parliament House are either by **taxi** (there are pick-up areas outside each terminal) – the cost is usually about \$30; or by **train** to St James ([www.airportlink.com.au/](http://www.airportlink.com.au/)). The Domestic Rail Station is located midway along the walkway connecting Terminals 2 and 3 (look for the signs). The trains run at approximately 10 minute intervals and take about 10 minutes to reach St James. It is another 10 minute walk from the Station to Parliament House. The fare (Jan 2009) is \$14.60 one-way (\$22.20 return), with a student concession fare of \$9.90 single (\$15.20 return) - student passes are required.
