*5155 RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE OFFICE OF TRANSPORT SAFETY INVESTIGATIONS REPORT—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

What is the Government doing to address the five recommendations in the Office of Transport Safety Investigations Report, dated 28 April 2016, regarding a fire involving State Transit Bus MO 1414 in Dudley, New South Wales?

Answer—

Roads and Maritime Services has issued a directive to all bus operators, requiring each operator to review procedures following the activation of on-board alarms; current inspection methodologies and systems and processes as part of an operator's accreditation requirements.

These reviews are monitored as part of independent Roads and Maritime audits and within operator self-assessment processes.

Further requirements for ongoing bus driver training are outlined in the Safety Management Handbook for bus and coach operators.

Roads and Maritime, in conjunction with BusNSW, has also developed and distributed a bus driver incident pocket guide for operators.

*5156 CRIMINAL TRIALS IN COUNTRY AREAS AND REGIONAL NEW SOUTH WALES—Mr Philip Donato asked the Attorney General—

(1) What is the Government doing to address the unnecessary delays in criminal trials within country areas and regional New South Wales?

(2) What is the Government going to address the backlog of criminal trials in country areas and regional New South Wales?

Answer—

The NSW Government has committed \$59 million to address the criminal trial backlog in the District Court. In country and regional areas, this funding has been used to appoint additional District Court judges, increase sitting weeks and introduce a range of initiatives including special call-overs, pre-trial conferences and initial plea discussions.

The Government's additional funding means that a District Court judge will be based permanently at Wagga Wagga in the Riverina for the first time from July 2017. A new District Court judge will also serve in New England, sitting at both Tamworth and Armidale. There are more than 400 scheduled sitting weeks in major country venues in 2017, compared with 143 sitting weeks in 2010.

*5158 LAND OWNED BY ROADS AND MARITIME SERVICES—Ms Julia Finn asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

(4) What plans are there to purchase additional parcels of land in the years from 2017 to 2021 (from 28 March 2017)?

Answer—

Land required by Roads and Maritime Services for future road works is ordinarily reserved in the Local Environment Plans held by local councils. Roads and Maritime may already own some parcels within these reservations and the land is held until a project is completed. Individual projects will detail specific property requirements.

*5159 NUMBER OF DISTRICT COURT JUDGES—Mr Philip Donato asked the Attorney General—

(1) How many current serving District Court Judges are there presently appointed in New South Wales (as at 29 March 2017)?

(2) How many District Court Judges actively served the state of New South Wales in each financial year

from 2006-07 to 2016-17?

Answer—

As at 29 March 2017, there were 67 serving District Court judges including the Chief Judge. This number does not include eight currently serving in other jurisdictions or acting judges.

In 2006-07, there were 64 District Court judges.

*5160 FUNDING FOR EMPLOYMENT OF DISTRICT COURT JUDGES—Mr Philip Donato asked the Attorney General—

- (1) How much funding has the Government allocated to the employment of District Court Judges in New South Wales in the 2016-17 financial year?

Answer—

- (1) 2016-17 funding for judicial salaries and related expenses was set out in Budget Paper 3, allocated to Courts and Tribunal Judiciary Services in the Department of Justice.
- (2) Funding for 2017-18 will be set out in the upcoming state budget.

What additional assistance will be available to local Cootamundra small businesses after 220 people lost their jobs in the recent closure of the Manildra Meat Company works at Cootamundra?

Answer—

The Government funds the Business Connect advisory program, which provides quality small business advice through an extensive network of mobile advisors. Business Connect advisers employed to cover the Cootamundra region have been made aware that local small businesses may require additional assistance given the recent closure of the Manildra Meat Company (Manildra).

In addition to this, Training Services NSW:

 - (4) How will the 22 children under the age of 12, living on the track be protected from damage to their health from sustained noise exposure?
 - (5) How will concerns of potential hearing damage to the residents living on the track who will be exposed to prolonged sound levels above 95dB be addressed?
 - (6) In view of the distress and anxiety caused by loud sound to dementia-sufferers, how will the dementia-affected residents inside the circuit be protected?
 - (7) Sound modelling suggests that noise levels within homes a few metres from the track will be well in excess of safe levels, even for short-term (15 minutes or more) exposure. What advice is to be offered to affected families?
 - (8) Will there be an independent sound pressure study conducted before the race?
 - (9) Will relocation be offered to residents?
 - (a) If so, when?
 - (b) If so, who is responsible for co-ordinating this?

Answer—

- (1) No, the front rooms of more than 150 residents are not within 3 metres of the track. A number of properties' boundaries are within 3 to 5 metres of the track.
- (2) No, this is not a precedent. There are a number of properties on the Gold Coast and in Adelaide whose boundaries are within 3 to 5 metres of the track.
- (3) Ensuring public safety and welfare is the first priority throughout the event. Supercars Australia is working with acoustic engineers and NSW Government agencies to develop a noise management plan that will identify and work to mitigate noise related impacts during the event.
- (4) and (5) Refer to the response of question 3.
- (6) The Government is committed to working with Supercars Australia to make the Newcastle 500 a successful and safe event for the community. The welfare and safety of residents and business owners in the precinct is paramount.
NSW Health is being closely consulted with regards to the event impact, and ensuring elderly and vulnerable residents receive all necessary care.

- (8) Supercars Australia will conduct sound monitoring during the Newcastle 500 race as per its sporting regulations. CAMS will be involved in this monitoring as it conducts the judicial process.
- (9) No formal relocation is being offered to residents. However, Supercars Australia is working with a number of special circumstances on a case by case basis to determine the best outcome for their situation.

- (1) What assessment has the Government done on the potential that net meter tariffs can influence the time of day that a household with solar panels uses the electricity it produces or feeds electricity onto the grid?
 - (a) What are the conclusions?
 - (2) To what extent has the Government investigated ways that net meter tariffs for solar panel owners can encourage the delivery of renewable energy onto the grid during peak demand, particularly on very hot days when demand exceeds supply?
 - (3) What investigation will the Government undertake into ways that would encourage solar panel owners to feed solar energy onto the grid during times of peak demand?
 - (4) What assessment has the Government made on how private solar panels can contribute to supplying the state's energy needs during peak demand?

Answer—

(1) The Government considered this issue when preparing terms of reference for a special review by the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART). The review is underway and is considering the voluntary benchmark range for solar feed-in tariffs paid by electricity retailers in New South Wales in financial year 2017-18.

(1) (a) IPART released its draft determination on 1 May 2017. According to IPART, the most financial benefit for solar households will come from self-consumption of their solar generation.

In terms of exporting solar power to the grid, IPART considers that the value of electricity generation at a given time of day is signalled through the wholesale electricity market. As such IPART has used forecasted wholesale market prices to establish the draft benchmark range for a voluntary solar feed-in tariff.

The draft benchmark range released by I PART for 2017-18 has a lower value of 11.6 cents per kilowatt hour and an upper value of 14.6 cents per kilowatt hour. The upper value reflects the 'peak time' period from 2 to 4pm when solar exports are most highly valued. The lower value reflects the 'off peak time' at all other times of the day.

(2) The Government investigated this issue when preparing the terms of reference for the !PART review noted in response to Question 1.

(3) The Government will continue to assess any appropriate opportunities to encourage uptake of solar energy based on changes in the market and as part of ongoing policy and regulatory review.

The Commonwealth Government's Finkel Review is currently considering the future of the National Electricity Market. Any outcome from this review will be taken into account by the Government when considering investigations into the role of distributed generation and associated feed-in tariffs.

(4) The Government continues to monitor the contribution of private solar panels as part of the New South Wales electricity supply mix. During the heatwave on 10 February 2017, at the time of peak demand, renewables provided 27 per cent of total New South Wales electricity generation. This figure is inclusive of the contribution by private solar generation.

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*5216 SYDNEY OPERA HOUSE LIGHT TOWER—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Planning, Minister for Housing, and Special Minister for State representing the Minister for Resources, Minister for Energy and Utilities, Minister for Arts, Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) What is the purpose of the permanent light tower built on the forecourt across from the Sydney Opera House steps on the boundary with the Royal Botanic Gardens?
- (2) What is the height of the light tower?
- (3) What was the cost to build the tower?
- (4) What process was undertaken for its approval?
- (5) What consultation was conducted with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization on the light tower before it was built, given it is within a UNESCO Buffer Zone?
- (6) What consultation was conducted with the NSW Heritage Council on the light tower before it was built, given it is on a state and national significant site?
- (7) What consultation was conducted with the Royal Botanic Gardens and Domain Trust on the light tower before it was built, given it is on the boundary of the Royal Botanic Gardens?

Answer—

(1) The purpose of the light pole is to light the Sydney Opera House monumental steps, forecourt and podium level, as well as the shared pedestrian and vehicle zone at the entry to the site, for the safety and security of patrons and visitors.

(2) The height of the light pole is 33 metres above the forecourt level.

(3) The cost to supply and install the light pole was \$450,000 (ex GST).

(4) The project to design and install the light pole was undertaken in line with the Utzon Design Principles, the Sydney Opera House Lighting Master Plan and the Sydney Opera House Conservation Management Plan.

A Heritage Impact Statement was prepared in accordance with the principles and processes of the Australia International Council on Monuments and Sites Burra Charter 2013 and the NSW Office of Environment and Heritage's guidelines for Statements of Heritage Impact.

The project received approval under the NSW Heritage Act 1977 in November 2015 and was determined as exempt development under the State Environmental Planning Policy (State Significant Precincts) 2005.

(5) Consultation with the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization was not required.

(6) An application for approval to install the light pole was made under the NSW Heritage Act 1977 in August 2015. The application was publicly exhibited during September and October 2015. The NSW Heritage Council approved the application in November 2015.

(7) The Royal Botanic Gardens and Domain Trust was consulted on the location and design of the light pole.

- (1) Roads and Maritime Services is negotiating with property owners about acquiring property for the M4-M5 Link.
