Answer—

I am advised:

The Business Integrated Management System (BIMS) is used to record all staff movements and placements electronically. Information in BIMS is overridden when new data is entered. BIMS does not store historical information in a format which can be retrieved easily. The resources required to answer this question cannot be justified.

*4629 DRUG COURT OPERATING COSTS—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General, and Minister for Justice—

What was the cost of operating the following courts in 2012-13:

- (a) Parramatta Drug Court;
- (b) Toronto Drug Court;
- (c) Sydney Drug Court at the Downing Centre?

I am advised:

The operating costs incurred by the Department of Attorney General and Justice, Legal Aid NSW and the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions for the NSW Drug Court in the 2012-13 financial year is as follows:

I am advised:

In comparing the number positions involved in the direct supervision of offenders on community based orders by geographical location before and after the merger of the Community Compliance and Monitoring Group (CCMG) with Community Offender Services (COS), it is important to note that CCMG and COS officers were co-located at some of these locations and serviced a wider geographical area. Since the merger, a number of Community Corrections offices require fewer officers as they service smaller areas more effectively with changed work practices.

*4632 NUMBER OF ESCAPES FROM POLICE CUSTODY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General, and Minister for Justice representing the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Minister for the Hunter, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

How many escapes from NSW Police custody occurred in the periods:

- (a) 1 July 2011 to 30 June 2012;
- (b) 1 July 2012 to 30 June 2013?

*4633 ESCAPES FROM FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICES—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Women—

How many escapes from Family and Community Services and its Agencies occurred in the periods:

- (a) 1 July 2011 to 30 June 2012;
- (b) 1 July 2012 to 30 June 2013?

Answer—

Department of Family and Community Services generally does not have the authority to detain people.

*4634 MOUNT DRUITT SWIMMING POOL—Mr Richard Amery asked the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Small Business—

- (1) Was the site of the Mount Druitt swimming pool previously Crown Lands before it was transferred to the Blacktown City Council?
- (2) When was the site transferred to Blacktown City Council?
- (3) At the time of transfer, was the land for use as a public swimming pool?
- (4) Was there any condition imposed that the land must be used for a public swimming pool?
 - (a) If so, is the Minister aware that the Blacktown City Council proposes to close the swimming pool, and sell the land for residential development?

Answer—

- (1) No. The land has been held under freehold title since 1874.
- (2) The site was transferred from the then landowner, NSW Planning and Environment Commission, to Blacktown City Council in 1998.

*4635 EYE SURGERIES AT JOHN HUNTER HOSPITAL—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

- (1) How many eye surgeries have been performed at John Hunter Hospital over the past twelve months?
- (2) How many eye surgeries were performed at John Hunter Hospital in the previous twelve months?

*4636 EYE PATIENT CARE IN THE HUNTER REGION—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

- (1) What alternative options for treatment are available to non-urgent eye patients in the Hunter region now that the public eye clinic at John Hunter Hospital has closed?
- (2) Will these alternative options for treatment cost non-urgent patients more?

Answer—

I am advised:

Ophthalmology surgery continues to be offered through the Hunter New England Local Health District. Patients who require routine, non-urgent care have a range of options including seeing ophthalmologists in their private rooms, or other specialists, GPs and optometrists in addition to referral to the state ophthalmic facility, the Sydney Eye Hospital.

*4637 REVIEW OF NEWCASTLE BUSES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport—

When will the 2013 comprehensive review of Newcastle buses occur?

Answer—

I am advised:

As part of the new timetable, which started on 20 October 2013, 30 extra bus services a week were introduced for Newcastle.

Further, numerous bus timetables in the Lower Hunter have been adjusted to ensure they align with new train arrival and departure times at key railway stations in the region.

Transport for NSW will undertake the next review of bus services in the Lower Hunter during 2014.

*4638 NEWCASTLE TRANSPORT PASSENGER COUNTS—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport—

Regarding passenger counts on Newcastle bus, train and ferry services currently being undertaken by the Government in preparation for the introduction of light rail in Newcastle:

- (1) How will these passenger counts inform the light rail planning process?
- (2) Will the data from these passenger counts be made public?
- (3) If so, from where will this information be available?

Answer—

I am advised:

Passenger counts are being used to supplement existing data sources to further support our understanding of current travel patterns and inform the planning process for the Newcastle Light Rail Project.

*4639 COASTAL WETLAND PROTECTION—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, and Minister Assisting the Premier on Infrastructure NSW, Leader of the House—

Will all council and privately owned coastal wetlands retain the same level of protection under the new planning laws?

Answer—

I am advised that:

Areas of high conservation values, including coastal wetlands, will be protected under the new laws.

All current protections for natural resources and the environment will be maintained during the transition phase.

The Government will work with local communities at the start of the planning process to identify and protect what is important at a local level.

*4640 GAME COUNCIL OF NSW FUNDING RECOMMENDATION—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Small Business—

In section "6.5.4 Recommendations" of the Governance Review of the Game Council of NSW, Steve Dunn states "Consideration should be given to setting funding at a percentage of total license income":

- (1) Does the Government plan to follow this recommendation?
- (2) If so, what percentage of total license income will be given to funding of the Game Board?

Answer—

(1) The Government in its response to the recommendation "Consideration should be given to setting funding at a percentage of total licence income" outlined, "Support in principle, however revenue from licence sales will need to be reviewed."

(2) The question of percentage of total licence income to fund the Board is yet to be determined.

*4641 VACANT PUBLIC HOUSING PROPERTIES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Women—

- (1) How many vacant Public Housing properties are there in Sydney?
- (2) How many vacant Public Housing properties are there in the Hunter region?

Answer—

The number of Land and Housing Corporation properties that are vacant in any area changes on a daily basis.

*4642 REDUCED WORKERS COMPENSATION BENEFITS—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Treasurer, and Minister for Industrial Relations—

How many workers in the following postcode areas have been advised that their workers compensation benefits have been or are able to be reduced since the introduction of the workers compensation changes:

- (a) 2307;
- (b) 2284;

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- (c) 2285;
- (d) 2305;
- (e) 2299;
- (f) 2287

Answer—

This question would be more appropriately directed to the Minister for Finance and Services.

*4643 CHILD ABUSE SQUAD—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Attorney General, and Minister for Justice representing the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Minister for the Hunter, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) What is the desired average caseload of police officers in NSW Police child abuse squads?
- (2) Taking into account the two new constables assigned to Newcastle's child abuse squad, what is that squad's current average caseload?
- (3) Are the recent Newcastle child abuse squad appointments new positions or transferred positions?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) No two caseloads are identical, making comparisons difficult. There is no standard desired average caseload for officers in the NSW Police Force's Child Abuse Squad.
- (2) 34 cases per officer per annum.
- (3) The positions were transferred from other squads in the State Crime Command.

*4645 WESTCONNEX PROJECT—Mr Ryan Park asked the Minister for Transport representing the Minister for Roads and Ports—

- (1) Why was a toll for the Westconnex announced that is considerably less than what the toll will be when the project is completed?
- (2) Why has the location of pollution tunnels not been outlined?
- (3) Why have specific homes that will need to be acquired as part of the project not been identified?
- (4) Why are you unable to release the full business case for this project?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) Exact tolling details were announced on 31 October 2013. Further details are available online at www.westconnex.com.au.
- (2) Locations of ventilation outlets for tunnels will be outlined in the environmental impact statements for each section, with the community consulted during this process.
- (3) The concept design for the M4 Widening project was placed on display for comment and owners of directly affected properties have been contacted individually.

The concept design for the M4 East is being finalised and will also be placed on public display. Owners of directly affected properties will be contacted when the concept design is finalised.

- (4) The WestConnex business case is a Commercial in Confidence document. An executive summary of the business case is available on the website www.westconnex.com.au.

*4646 RECOVERY ORIENTED MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Mental Health, Minister for Healthy Lifestyles, and Minister for Western New South Wales—

- (1) What is the Government's policy on recovery oriented mental health services?
- (2) What mental health services in New South Wales operate using a recovery oriented framework?
 - (a) How does the Government assess this?
- (3) How does the Government support or promote recovery oriented mental health services?
- (4) What training or professional development does the Government provide or fund for these services?
- (5) What plans does the Government have to expand the use of the recovery oriented framework?
- (6) What further action will the Government take to support recovery oriented mental health?

Answer—

I am advised:

In 2012 the Government established the NSW Mental Health Commission and asked it to develop a draft Strategic Plan for Mental Health in New South Wales. Consultation on the plan is currently under way,

and the Commission has made a commitment to ensuring that it embodies the ideas of autonomy and recovery.

New South Wales public mental health services are recovery-oriented in line with national policy directions under The roadmap for national mental health reform, 2012-22 and the Fourth national mental health plan, 2009-14. The first priority under the national plan is the adoption of a recovery oriented culture within mental health services, underpinned by appropriate values and service models. The NSW Chief Psychiatrist is leading this work as Chair of the National Safety and Quality Partnership Standing Committee.

The NSW Ministry of Health is currently developing a number of Mental Health Clinical Service Standards for statewide implementation. These standards aim to measure and underpin the delivery of high quality recovery-oriented mental health services across NSW. Phased implementation of the Clinical Service Standards in NSW Local Health Districts is expected from mid-2014.

Over the last two years the NSW Ministry of Health has been supporting the roll out of nationally consistent mental health training based on the National Mental Health Practice Standards (Mental Health Professional On-line Development – MHPOD) across all Local Health Districts and Networks. This comprehensive range of approximately 60 training modules have both embedded recovery principles and specific modules supporting recovery based care.

The NSW Mental Health Commission will host a forum event, Recovery in Practice, on 27 November 2013, to discuss recovery-oriented support for people who experience mental illness at different stages of life. Mental health service and clinical leaders from Local Health Districts across New South Wales will attend.

*4647 SCHOOL BUS SERVICES IN THE INNER CITY—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Education—

Regarding proposed changes to high school catchment boundaries in response to Sydney Secondary College being at capacity:

(1) What feedback about transport changes did inner city schools and parents provide as part of the consultation on this proposal?

Answer—

I am advised that written feedback was provided by three of the six Parents and Citizens Associations consulted on the proposal to change the enrolment boundary for in-area students attending Crown Street Public School, Bourke Street Public School, Plunkett Street Public School and Darlinghurst Public School from Sydney Secondary College, Balmain Campus to Alexandria Park Community School. Comments were submitted regarding improvements to transport.

*4648 MAJOR NATIONAL PARTNERSHIP PLAN - HEALTH—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Treasurer, and Minister for Industrial Relations—

Budget Paper 2 lists the Major National Partnerships Plan and Projects in Table 7.9 (pages 7-20): Why is there a list of National Partnership Health Projects valued at \$536 million when Table 7.8 (page 7-17) indicates that only \$447 million is available in funding?

Answer—

Tables 7.8 and 7.9 are not directly comparable because Table 7.9 only lists selected (major) National Partnerships (NPs) and because each table has a different functional classification.

In this case, the difference is primarily because Table 7.9 includes an estimated \$146 million in 2013-14 for the Health and Hospital Fund – Regional Priority Rounds projects. This payment is classified under Nation Building Plan for the Future in Table 7.8, since the Health and Hospital Fund was initially announced in the Australian Government's 2008-09 Budget and became part of a program of investment in nation building infrastructure announced in its 2009-10 Budget.

*4649 GAMBLING TAX REVENUE—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Treasurer, and Minister for Industrial Relations—

The Budget Paper 2 (page 6-16) notes the future of gambling taxes and the falling revenue from racing over the forward estimates:

- (1) Is this fall in revenue a sign of successful Government strategies designed to reduce gambling in our community?
- (2) Is this fall in revenue being addressed by the Government?

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(3) Does the Government have any capacity or intent to address the lost opportunity for revenue through online betting?

Answer—

- (1) The expected fall in revenue from racing over the period 2012-13 to 2016-17 reflects an expected reduction in betting on New South Wales totalisators due to intensified interstate and online competition.
- (2) The Government seeks to ensure that the overall level of tax revenue remains adequate to meet the needs of the State.
- (3) The NSW Government considers that the regulation of online gambling is a Commonwealth matter.

*4650 WAITING TIMES FOR PUBLIC HOUSING MAINTENANCE—Mr Nick Lalich asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Women—

What is the average waiting time for the resolution of maintenance issues in public housing properties in the Cabramatta Electorate?

Answer—

Time frames for responsive repairs vary depending on the urgency of the matter.

Approximately 90 per cent of works orders issued are completed within agreed time frames, with the balance being resolved shortly after. Delays may be a result of property access issues and unforeseen site conditions.

*4651 PUBLIC HOUSING MAINTENANCE FUNDING—Mr Nick Lalich asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Women—

How much funding has been allocated to maintenance for public housing properties in the Cabramatta electorate for 2013-14?

Answer—

The Land and Housing Corporation allocates an annual maintenance budget to deliver responsive and planned repairs, and upgrading based on forecast requirements.

*4652 NEW SCHOOL BANKING SYSTEM INTEREST—Ms Carmel Tebbutt asked the Minister for Education—

- (1) Will Treasury retain the interest earned from government funding for schools when the Department of Education and Communities moves to a new single banking system for schools?
- (2) If so, how much interest will this be?

Answer—

After schools transition into the new finance system, individual schools will not accrue interest on the limited level of government cash that had previously been partly provided in advance.

*4653 LENNOX BRIDGE REDEVELOPMENT—Mrs Barbara Perry asked the Minister for the Environment, and Minister for Heritage—

Regarding the redevelopment of the former David Jones site at or near Church Street, Parramatta:

Why has the Lennox Bridge heritage branch submission to the Heritage Council been dismissed and no other alternatives assessed?

Answer—

I am advised as follows:

The Heritage Council of NSW fully considered the Heritage Branch submission in making its determination about Lennox Bridge.

- (1) Will the relevant legislation be amended to enable voters in the Shellharbour Local Government Area to directly elect the Mayor of Shellharbour City Council?
- (2) If not, why not?

Answer—

I provide the following details in response to your questions:

The Local Government Act 1993 currently provides that a council can have a popularly elected mayor where the electors decide at a referendum that the mayor is to be elected by the electors. The decision to hold such a referendum is a matter for each council. A decision made at a referendum takes effect at the next ordinary election of the council.

On what date will the Yallah to Oak Flats planning study be publicly released?
