 - (2) How many fully qualified paramedics are employed by NSW Ambulance Service?
 - (3) How many paramedics in training are employed by NSW Ambulance Service?
 - (4) How many vacancies currently exist for qualified paramedics?
 - (5) What population figures are used to determine staffing levels of individual stations?
 - (6) What enhancement to paramedic numbers are planned over the next three years?
- 0256 COMPLIANCE COSTS—Ms Clover Moore to ask the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Women—

Noting the national survey of the costs of service standards and compliance costs for Government-funded community organisations that shows over 70 per cent carry out multiple compliance assessments, more

than 40 per cent spend more than 280 hours completing reports, two months of a full-time position is spent on standards and compliance each year, and fewer than 20 per cent report benefits from these requirements:

With regard to the worst polluting power stations Munmorah and Mount Piper:

- (1) What plans does the Government have to increase energy efficiency and reduce pollution of these power stations?
- (2) What improvements are expected and how long will they take?
- (3) What consideration will the Government give to phasing out these power stations to transfer to more efficient forms of electricity production and distribution?
- 0259 VERY FAST TRAIN—Ms Clover Moore to ask the Minister for Transport—

With respect to proposals for a High Speed Rail to operate between Brisbane, Sydney, Canberra and Melbourne, and noting that the Commonwealth Government has a feasibility study underway on this proposal:

- (1) What assessment has the Government done on the costs and benefits of this proposal?
- (2) What contribution has the Government made to date for a joint Commonwealth, State and Territory commitment to high speed rail?
- (3) What is the Government's policy on this proposal?
- (4) What plans does the Government have to contribute to the success of this proposal?
- 0260 BAYS PRECINCT—Ms Clover Moore to ask the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, and Minister Assisting the Premier on Infrastructure NSW—

- (1) Is the Government committed to developing a long term strategic planning framework/ master plan for the whole Bays Precinct area?
- (2) If so, what timeframe has the Government set for finalising the plan?
- (3) To what extent will the Government halt consideration and approval of development proposals until an integrated framework or plan has been finalised?

 - (e) local community organisations;
 - (f) adult education providers?
- (4) What other plans does the Government have to expand literacy education?
- 0263 GARDENS OF STONE ACTIVITY—Ms Clover Moore to ask the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, and Minister Assisting the Premier on Infrastructure NSW—

With regard to mining operations in the Gardens of Stone:

- (1) Is the Government aware of widespread concerns that the proposed open-cut mine in the Ben Bullen State Forest within the Gardens of Stone will:
 - (a) impact on the sandstone sculpted landscape;
 - (b) clearfell, scalp and destroy 1,088 hectares of old growth forest, turning them into piles of waste rock:
 - (c) destroy the habitat of at least 32 threatened native animals including the lyrebird, regent

honeyeater, tiger quoll and powerful owl;

- (d) contradict the responsibility of Forests NSW to manage State forests based on principles of ecological sustainability?
- (2) Will the Government ban open-cut mining in the public forests of the scenic and diverse Gardens of Stone region, given that the intensive underground mining has already exceeded an appropriate resource management balance for this sensitive region?
- (3) To what extent is the Government committed to minimising, adequately treating and discharging any waste effluent from coal mines away from the World Heritage area?
- (4) Will the Government require subsidence management plans for coal mining that includes subsidence protection for the Newnes Plateau pagodas, cliffs, streams and in particular upland swamps, noting that longwall mining is listed as a Key Threatening Process to these swamps under the Threatened Species Conservation Act, 1995?

Authorised by the Parliament of New South Wales
