Will the Minister please outline the steps taken to investigate and prosecute private training colleges which breach standards?

Answer-

Training provider quality in New South Wales is safeguarded by the NSW Quality Framework which includes a rigorous application process, and set performance standards within Smart and Skilled contracts.

Smart and Skilled has strict contractual requirements on ethical marketing - reports of offering inappropriate inducements to students (including free laptops and spotter fees) will be investigated and tough contract penalties and sanctions may apply including referral to Australian Skill Quality Authority (ASQA), the national regulator.

For providers that fail to meet contract standards, the Department can enforce sanctions, which include withholding payments, removing allocations and suspension or termination of the contract, depending on the degree of non-compliance.

The referral did not require any advice in response, provided that a report under section 11 of the Act was not deemed necessary. In January 2016, the Department reviewed the information forwarded by the ICAC and determined it did not reveal any new information to that previously canvassed.

No issues were identified that warranted reporting under section 11 of the Act.

Answer-

- (1) The Government is proud to have led the initiative to phase out microbeads in personal care products nationally. We formed the NSW Microplastics Working Group in 2014 to develop an evidence based approach. The working group includes leading scientists, industry and environmental groups, as well as Commonwealth and Government representatives. The group's work informed the decision by the Australian environment ministers to phase out microbeads. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) continues to work closely with the Commonwealth Government and industry to develop and negotiate the terms of the industry agreement.
- (2) The EPA is working closely with leading industry groups to ensure that the agreement will be effective. As set out in the resolution of the Australian environment ministers made on 15 December 2015, 'Ministers agreed that they would consider further actions, if required to address outstanding products that contain microbeads.' This resolution is available on the Commonwealth Department of the Environment website at www.environment.gov.au.
- (3) Personal care products can take a number of years to reformulate. This period closely aligns with the phase out periods in other jurisdictions such as the USA. It enables industry to source alternative ingredients which are 'benign by design'. The Commonwealth Government announced on 29 February 2016 that it will introduce legislation to ban microbeads on 1 July 2017 if a voluntary approach has not already achieved an effective ban.
- (4) This approach being taken was agreed by the Australian environment ministers at the December 2015 meeting.
- (5) The Government supported the agreed approach, although it also advocated a legislated ban at the end of the voluntary phase-out.

Regulation of the work of utility companies is provided for under legislation, including the Electricity Supply Act 1995, Gas Supply Act 1996 and Sydney Water Act 1994. There are specific obligations when it comes to work carried out on public reserves or roads (the definition of which includes footpaths).

These include an obligation to consult and an obligation to make good any damage made in the course of carrying out work (Electricity Supply Act 1995). As councils are responsible for roads in their local area, coordination of works that impact on roads is primarily the shared responsibility of councils and utility companies.

Utility companies are also guided by Codes of Practice; electricity companies refer to the NSW Code of Practice for Authorised Network Operators, which is approved under the

Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000. The State Environmental Planning Policy (Infrastructure) 2007 sets out planning provisions and development controls for telecommunication facilities in New South Wales.
