### Answer-

### I am advised:

(1) Bikes are permitted on trains free of charge in the period outside of the peak. Should any part of the journey be made on weekdays between 6.00 am and 9.00 am or 3.30 pm and 7.30 pm, customers must purchase a child ticket for the bike in addition to their own ticket.

When customers travel with a folding bike with dimensions (in its bag) of 82 cm length x 69 cm height x 39 cm width, and a maximum wheel rim diameter of 51 cm, the bike travels free of charge at any time.

This follows a trial which found that allowing folding bikes during peak periods did not adversely affect the comfort or flow of passengers.

(2) There are no plans to make changes to the existing fare policy for standard bicycles.

- (3) and (4) All new train procurements for the CityRail network commenced under this Government will consider the requirements of cyclists.
- (5) and (6) Under current regulations, buses with bike racks fitted may exceed the maximum permitted length of the bus.

With regard to the ban on RailCorp premises of companion animals other than guide dogs, hearing dogs, dogs trained to assist a person to alleviate the effects of their disability on public transport, assistance dogs in training, police dogs on duty, and police dogs in training:

- (1) Why does the ban apply to all premises including tunnels, thoroughfares, arcades and land under viaducts?
- (2) What consideration will the Government give to allowing companion animals under the effective control of their owner, such as dogs restrained by a leash or cats confined in a container, on some RailCorp premises?

#### Answer-

#### I am advised:

- (1) The Rail Safety (Offences) Regulation 2008 provides that it is an offence to bring an animal onto trains and RailCorp premises except under the conditions imposed by RailCorp.
  - The regulations ensure that safety remains the paramount concern in relation to customers and staff and that the hygiene of trains and premises is of a quality standard.
- (2) Both the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cth) and the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW) provide for the legal right of persons with disabilities to be accompanied by an animal or dog (Cth) or a dog (NSW), that assists the person in respect of their disability or is trained to alleviate the effect of the disability. Certain organisations are accredited under law to provide training to such animals and RailCorp recognises these accredited organisations.
  - Animals outside these descriptions come under the Rail Safety (Offences) Regulations, the purpose of which is to ensure the primary concern of the transport system is safety for its customers and staff and that the hygiene of trains and premises is of a quality standard.
