*1254 DATA ON MARINE SPECIES—Ms Tamara Smith asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

What measures does the Department of Primary Industries propose to provide further data on marine species which are likely to be threatened and yet are data deficient, considering that recently the smooth hammerhead shark (nominated for listing as a threatened species) was refused by the Fisheries Scientific Committee due to a lack of data?

Answer-

The Department of Primary Industries continues to work collaboratively with universities and funding agencies to increase the Department's knowledge on marine species which are likely to be threatened. I can advise that the Department has an ongoing collaborative research project on the Smooth Hammerhead Shark with the University of Newcastle.

*1255 SHARK CONTROL PROGRAM—Ms Tamara Smith asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

How will the \$100,000 promised by the Premier prior to the 2015 election for a review of new shark control technologies (including deterrents and barriers) provided to the Shark Control Program be allocated and used?

Answer-

The first step of the funding commitment has been to commission an independent review of the scientific literature and promotional material on the commercially available and any advanced prototypes of shark-detecting and shark-deterring technologies. The review will identify technologies that could potentially be trialled at New South Wales beaches and that may warrant further consultation with stakeholders.

The second step will be to convene a Shark Summit to discuss the outcomes of this independent review. The workshop will include scientists working in relevant fields, representatives from government agencies and non-governmental organisations, key stakeholder groups and surf life savers. Attendees will deliberate and rank the outcomes of the independent review. The overall aim of the summit will be to make a recommendation to DPI regarding which technologies to trial and the most appropriate ways of evaluating them (including which popular beaches might be used if field trials were recommended).

The third and final step undertaken is to undertake a preliminary trial of those technologies that show greatest promise for NSW conditions. It is anticipated that more advanced or longer term trials may also be required and planning for these will also be done during this third step of the project.

- *1256 SHARK CONTROL (BATHER PROTECTION) PROGRAM—Ms Tamara Smith asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—
 - (1) When will the next five-year review of the Shark Control (Bather Protection) Program (SCP) report be completed and released?
 - (2) What scientific data does the Department of Primary Industries rely on when setting trigger points for the entanglement of threatened species in the SCP, considering six critically endangered Grey Nurse Sharks were killed in the 2012-13 season and no review was triggered, yet one humpback whale was killed in 2014 and a review was triggered?

- (3) Has the trigger point been reviewed in light of new listings of hammerhead sharks in New South Wales?
- (4) Has there been any research conducted by the Department of Primary Industries into how the SCP may affect recently listed threatened species in New South Wales?

Answer-

- (1) The Department of Primary Industries and the Office of Environment and Heritage have completed their five-year review of the two Joint Management Agreements that authorise and manage the NSW Government's Shark Meshing (Bather Protection) Program (NB not the Shark Control Program.)
 - The review report contains some recommendations that have informed development of a new draft Joint Management Agreement and a draft Management Plan for the Shark Meshing Program, and all three documents will be on public exhibition later this year.
- (2) The trigger points are an adaptive management tool implemented in 2009 through the Joint Management Agreements and the Management Plan for the Shark Management Program. They are used to monitor changes in the catch of threatened, endangered and protected species (TEPs), and other non-target species, in the Shark Meshing Program.

They are triggered when the catch over two consecutive years exceeds twice the annual average catch of the preceding 10 years. The animals only need to have been entangled so those released alive still count as a 'catch', reflecting the precautionary nature of the trigger points. Greynurse Sharks did not trip the trigger in 2012-13 as only a few of those sharks are caught, and they are often released alive, every year in the SMP.

The trigger point for Humpback whales was tripped in 2013-14 because two were caught (and released alive) in the 2012-13 meshing season. That is in contrast to the preceding 10 years where none were caught in the SMP.

The trigger points worked exactly as they were designed, and that is to draw the Department's attention to consistently higher than long-term average catches of a threatened, endangered or protected species and to investigate those catches.

- (3) The Joint Management Agreement for the Shark Meshing Program requires that the Agreement be reviewed following the listing of a new species as protected or threatened.
 - The 2011-12 Annual Performance Report reviewed the Joint Management Agreement following the May 2012 listing of Scalloped and Great Hammerheads and determined that no changes were required to the Agreement.
 - The 5-year review process has reviewed the threatened, endangered and protected species trigger points set in 2009 and proposes some changes.
- (4) Other than the two species of Hammerhead Sharks listed in 2012, which were reviewed under the Agreement, there have not been any recently listed threatened species that might be affected by the Shark Meshing Program.

The Management Plan for the Shark Meshing Program contains a detailed Scientific Research and Monitoring Program and is available on the website of the Department of Primary Industries.

*1257 LAW REFORM COMMISSION REPORT—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—

 - (a) If so, when?
 - (2) Has a location site for the program in the Illawarra been identified?

 - (3) What were the determining factors in selecting this location?

Safer Pathway commenced in September 2014 in Orange and Waverly. On 1 July 2015, the program expanded into four additional sites at Tweed Heads, Parramatta, Broken Hill and Bankstown.

 - (4) What is the expected total budget allocation to school aged children dental health programs in each of the years from 2015 to 2017?

Transport for NSW is currently investigating light rail serving Parramatta and Western Sydney on four shortlisted corridors:

- · Parramatta to Macquarie Park via Carlingford
- Parramatta to Castle Hill via Old Northern Road
- · Parramatta to Bankstown
- Parramatta to Sydney Olympic Park and Strathfield/Burwood

The four shortlisted routes have been subject to robust investigation, including detailed planning, engineering and customer analysis.

The Government will make an announcement on a preferred network in due course, once detailed planning and analysis is complete. This process takes time, but is critical to ensure the best transport solution for Parramatta and Western Sydney.

Opal readers are very reliable and the availability on buses and trains in Newcastle and the Stockton Ferry is almost 100 per cent.

 - (1) Which ferry services across New South Wales currently accept the Pensioner Excursion Ticket?
 - (2) Which ferry services across New South Wales will accept the Gold Opal card from 1 January 2016? Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) Currently only Sydney Ferries services, operated by Harbour City Ferries and Newcastle's Stockton Ferry, operated by the State Transit Authority, accept Pensioner Excursion Tickets purchased by the general public. To cater for residents in isolated communities, four other operators have special arrangements which allow eligible local residents to purchase a Pensioner Excursion Ticket onboard. These four operators are Cronulla and National Park Ferry Cruises, Church Point Ferry Service, Brooklyn Ferry and Palm Beach Ferry.
- (2) I'm advised Harbour City Ferries and Stockton Ferry already accept Gold Opal. All Private Ferry Services that currently accept Pensioner Excursion Tickets will also accept Gold Opal cards for residents.

On 4 September 2015, a new at-grade commuter car parking facility was opened at Thirroul, providing public transport customers with an additional 150 car parking spaces.

The new commuter car park is a short walk from Thirroul Station, makes use of Government owned land, and includes a range of customer safety features including security fencing, lighting and CCTV.

The new commuter car park benefits public transport customers who park-and-ride at Thirroul, including those who connect with the express services to the Sydney CBD. It also returns street parking to those who live, work and shop locally.

The existing car park, located on the north-western side of Thirroul Station, is the responsibility of Wollongong City Council.

Answer-

I am advised as follows:

- (1) The EPA has been working with the community and industry through the Rutherford Air Quality Liaison Committee to address odour issues around the Rutherford Industrial Estate through the Rutherford Odour Investigation Project. This has included the following key actions:
 - In December 2012, the EPA released an initial desktop assessment that recommended odour source sampling at up to 14 premises and computer modelling of odour dispersion.
 - In February 2014, the EPA released results of the odour sampling and dispersion modelling showing that an asphalt plant and textile manufacturer had the potential to cause offensive odours under normal operating conditions, and that two waste oil refineries could also be the source of offensive odours if pollution controls were not operating effectively.
 - In May 2014, the EPA released the results an olfactometry panel suggesting that community members are concerned about burnt oil, gassy and solvent odours.
 - In June 2014, the EPA issued a prevention notice to Fulton Hogan Industries Pty Ltd requiring it to identify odour controls for its asphalt plant. Odour controls were subsequently implemented and a second notice was issued by the EPA in March 2015 requiring ongoing monitoring and reporting.
 - In April 2015, the EPA issued a prevention notice to Wax Converters Textiles Pty Limited requiring it to take actions to ensure that odourous emissions are adequately dispersed.
 - Throughout this time, the EPA has maintained close surveillance of all premises in the Rutherford industrial area to ensure the proper and effective operation of pollution controls.
