What new programs has the Government rolled out to tackle major skills shortages identified in a recent Western Sydney skills audit?

Answer—

Implemented on 1 January 2015, Smart and Skilled includes an entitlement to government subsidised training up to and including Certificate III.

Under Smart and Skilled:

- the Targeted Priorities Program allows people who meet the Smart and Skilled eligibility criteria to enrol in subsidised training at Certificate IV, Diploma or Advanced Diploma level depending on the availability of funding.
- the Pre-vocational and Part Qualifications program including skills sets are targeted at key groups such as jobseekers, mature age workers returning to the workforce and retrenched workers as well as industries undergoing economic and structural change, needing to retrain or up-skill workers and industries experiencing skills shortages.

The Government has announced a number of initiatives commencing in 2016 to encourage participation in government subsidised training to meet skills needs:

- students with a Certificate IV or higher qualification will be able to access subsidised training at the Foundation skills and Certificate II and III level, provided the qualifications are on the NSW Skills List. More people will be able to undertake affordable training with up to 30,000 students set to benefit who want to reskill.
- traineeship fees will be capped at \$1,000 for the whole qualification. Apprenticeship fees are already capped at \$2,000.
- \$10 million is being invested to provide 2,000 places in courses in Disability, Community Services and Aged Care qualifications, which will support the rollout of the NDIS.
- all students with a disability will be eligible for free vocational education and training courses on the NSW Skills List.
- at a cost of \$10 million the fee free Pre-apprenticeship and Pre-traineeship Program will target school leavers and young people who are looking to enter into a trade apprenticeship or traineeship. Courses will be available in a variety of trades including construction, electrotechnology, cookery and early childhood education and care.
- to increase the take-up of STEM subjects from 1 January 2016 the Government will implement the \$25 million Jobs for Tomorrow scholarships. Over a period of four years students who undertake qualifications in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) subjects will be eligible for a scholarship valued at \$1,000.

In July 2015, the Government introduced the \$48 million Fee Free Scholarship program. The program provides 200,000 fee free training places over four years for students who meet the concession eligibility criteria with a priority for people in social housing or on the wait list. As of 26 October 2015, over 7,730 scholarships have been awarded.

The NSW Skills List is reviewed annually in consultation with industry. Ongoing feedback from stakeholders is taken into consideration in the annual review process. While the Western Sydney skills audit identified current shortages in business, finance and management; building; and electrotechnology, engineering and manufacturing, the number of government funded qualifications in these areas on the NSW Skills List include:

- 40 qualifications for manager occupations, 15 qualifications in sales and 30 qualifications for clerical and administrative occupations
- 32 qualifications in building
- 31 qualifications in electrotechnology, engineering and manufacturing.

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Currently there are 23 qualifications on the NSW Skills List in the future growth areas of tourism, hospitality and events.
