*0605 RECREATION, SPORTS AND AQUATICS CLUB—Ms Tania Mihailuk asked the Minister for Ageing, and Minister for Disability Services—

Will the Government consider providing additional funding to the Recreation, Sports and Aquatics Club, a group which provide sporting and social opportunities for people with physical, intellectual or sensory disabilities?

Answer—

This question was referred from the Treasurer to the Minister for Disability Services.

Yes. In 2010-2011, the Recreation, Sports and Aquatics Club (RSAC) was allocated a one-off grant of \$40,000 by Ageing, Disability and Home Care, as part of a pilot program to deliver recreational and social activities for children and adults with a disability.

In addition, the Sport and Recreation Participation Program administered by the Sport and Recreation division in the Office of Communities includes a disability grant component that is available to community-based organisations to increase opportunities for people with a disability to participate in sport and physical activities.

Organisations such as RSAC will have opportunities to apply for flexible respite funding under Stronger Together Two.

*0606 RIFLE SHOOTING IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS—Ms Tania Mihailuk asked the Attorney General, and Minister for Justice—

Regarding the proposal to introduce rifle shooting into NSW public schools:

- (1) What action will the Minister take to prevent this proposal from negatively impacting communities such as Bankstown?
- (2) What factors will the Government consider when determining whether such classes are appropriate for suburban schools?

Answer—

I am advised:

This proposal to amend the Firearms Act 1996 falls within the portfolio responsibilities of the Minister for Police and Emergency Services. The question should therefore be directed to the appropriate Minister. Questions regarding school curriculum are the responsibility of the Minister for Education and I note that you have also asked this question of the Minister for Education.

*0607 OFFICERS WORKING IN SPECIALIST CRIME SQUADS—Ms Tania Mihailuk asked the Attorney General, and Minister for Justice representing the Minister for Police and Emergency Services, Minister for the Hunter, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

Since 1 January 2011:

- (1) How many police officers from the Bankstown Local Area Command worked for part or all of the time in Specialist Crime Squads?
- (2) Will the Government commit to ensure that officers who are required to work outside the Local Area Command are replaced by an officers of equal rank and experience for the duration of their work?

Answer—

The NSW Police Force has advised me:

- (1) Between 1 January 2011 and 15 August 2011, ten officers from the Bankstown Local Area Command (LAC) were seconded to specialist crime squads within the State Crime Command (SCC). This was largely because the SCC has been leading investigations into offences occurring within the Bankstown LAC.
- (2) Operational policing requirements of the LAC are always taken into consideration with regard to secondments to other Commands. All Criminal Investigation secondments are closely monitored by the Region Operations Manager and Local Area Commanders to ensure that suitably skilled officers remain at the LACs concerned.

Will the Minister provide details of all District Court matters from Inverell, Tenterfield, Gwydir and Glen Innes that were heard in a District Court outside the region, due to the lack of District Court sittings in Inverell?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Chief Judge, under the District Court Act 1973, arranges sittings of the District Court.

The Chief Judge allocates judicial resources on the basis of his knowledge of general caseload trends, the number of cases awaiting hearing at locations, and the availability of other convenient venues.

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) The NSW Government has committed to an extra \$60 million over four years for Easy Access upgrades.

Currently the Department of Transport is reviewing the way stations are selected for an Easy Access upgrade in order to ensure the best possible outcome for public transport customers and the taxpayer.

After this review is completed, the location of Easy Access upgrades will be decided. The selection process has not been reviewed since 2006 and it is important to make sure spending is targeted for maximum benefit.

The Government is putting in more money and making sure upgrades are done to benefit the maximum number of customers.

- (2) In the 5 years between 2005 and 2010 patronage increased at Villawood (+3.3%) and Yennora (+13.8%) while it declined at Chester Hill (-5.0%).
- (3) In 2010, compared to 2005, there are an additional 6,000 passenger journeys at Villawood, 18,000 at Yennora while at Chester Hill there are 22,000 fewer passenger journeys.
