With regards concrete roads and surface treatments:

- (1) How much was budgeted to resurface Canterbury Road between King Georges Road and Punchbowl Road in the 2010-11 budget?
- (2) What was the value of works undertaken to treat Canterbury Road between King Georges Road and Punchbowl Road in the 2010-11 financial year?
- (3) What was the total value of works undertaken on this section of road since 2010?
- (4) How many concrete roads in the Sydney metropolitan area will receive the same surface treatment as Canterbury Road in the current financial year?
- (5) How many concrete roads in the Sydney metropolitan area will receive the same surface treatment as Canterbury Road in the next financial year?
- (6) What is the cost differential between an asphaltic resurfacing of concrete roads and the treatment undertaken on Canterbury Road?
- (7) Has any performance measurements been undertaken to examine noise and wet weather performance of asphalt surfaces and concrete surfaces?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) \$4.5 million.
- (2) \$4.6 million.
- (3) Crack sealing was the last component of the planned work in the project and was completed in December 2011. The final value of works undertaken in the project has totalled \$4.6 million.
- (4) The following three projects will include diamond grinding of the concrete surface this financial year:
  - Parramatta Road from Old Canterbury Road to Sloane Street, Summer Hill.
  - The Boulevarde from the Hume Highway to Redmyre Road, Strathfield.
  - Railway Road from the Princes Highway to Henry Street, Sydenham.
- (5) The following six projects will include diamond grinding or similar surface retexturing of the concrete surface next financial year:
  - New South Head Road, from Kent Street, Rose Bay to Old South Head Road, Vaucluse.
  - Old Windsor Road from Hammers Road to Oak Road, Old Toongabbie.
  - Old Windsor Road from Abbott Road to Seven Hills Road, Baulkham Hills.
  - Hume Highway from Burwood Road to Wentworth Road, Croydon.
  - Old Canterbury Road from 0.12 km south of Toothill Street to Rosedale Street, Lewisham.
  - Sydenham Road from Frazer Street to New Canterbury Road, Dulwich Hill.
- (6) Engineering and economic analysis carried out by Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) has confirmed that surface restoration of concrete roads by diamond grinding will achieve a saving in maintenance costs of up to 26 per cent over 30 years when compared to the traditional alternative of restoration by milling and resheeting with asphalt. These savings are achieved by allowing access to the concrete surface to repair cracks, spalls and joint stepping in a more timely manner as soon as they become evident. Savings are also achieved by not having to periodically remove and replace the asphalt surfacing.

Asphalt has traditionally been utilised as surfacing on urban concrete roads to restore and maintain an acceptable surface profile and to provide a smooth ride for the road user. However the new technology of diamond grinding now allows the same outcome at a lower long term cost. Therefore, in an endeavour to achieve the maintenance efficiency savings offered by this new best practice technology, RMS will utilise diamond grinding where possible when restoring the surfacing of low speed urban concrete State roads.

- (7) RMS engaged acoustic consultants Renzo Tonin & Associates to check the before-construction and post-construction pavement surface noise at selected locations on Canterbury Road over the section

which was restored with diamond grinding. The report was completed in October 2010 and found that there was a 2.6 dBA reduction in surface noise on the diamond-ground surface compared to the former asphalt surface.

Skid resistance testing was carried out by RMS on a diamond-ground test section of Canterbury Road in November 2010 between Pentland Avenue and Dudley Street. The results have not confirmed any significant change to skid resistance on the before and after surfaces, and in this respect RMS is looking to carry out further testing at other locations to investigate this aspect further.
