### Answer—

- (1) Once completed, Wynyard Walk will be fully integrated with Wynyard station. Transport for New South Wales will undertake a number of upgrades to the station to improve pedestrian flow. This includes installing additional ticket gates and widening the concourse area leading to the entrance of Wynyard Walk. Transport for NSW is also developing plans for more upgrades to Wynyard station to meet long term passenger demand and significantly increase station capacity.
  - The Wynyard Walk tunnel has been designed for a capacity of up to 20,000 pedestrians per hour, including surge capacity for special events. Long term demand incorporating current loads, future loads arising from the Barangaroo development plus general western CBD growth is not expected to exceed 16,000 pedestrians per hour during the average weekday peak.

- (2) The Barangaroo Integrated Transport Plan is currently being developed. It considers a range of measures for all transport modes to support Barangaroo. Transport for NSW is investigating capacity and efficiency enhancements for Wynyard station to cater for future growth in the CBD, including Barangaroo. Rail line and station capacity in the CBD is being considered as part of the development of the NSW Long Term Transport Master Plan.

With respect to cost-effective accessible transport for people with a disability, frail aged people and those with limited mobility or without private transport for health treatment, shopping and recreation:

Answer-

I am advised:

- (1) In 2011-12, South East Sydney Community Transport was provided \$813,415 under the Home and Community Care Program and \$76,915 under the NSW Community Transport Program.
- (2), (6) and (7) The previous Government did not allocate any growth funding for the Community Transport Program (other than for CPI adjustments) for more than 12 years.

In recognition of the important role that community transport plays in the lives of many people, the Government is committed to boosting the Community Transport Program by delivering on its promise to provide extra funding and improved services for passengers.

The Government has committed to increase Community Transport Program funding by \$12 million over four years, to provide transport-disadvantaged people with improved access to vital transport services. This represents a 100 per cent funding increase over the period.

(3) Data on community transport provided through the Home and Community Care Community (HACC) Transport Sub-program is reported to the Ageing, Disability and Home Care agency (Department of Family and Community Services) through Minimum Data Set reporting.

Data on community transport provided through the NSW Community Transport Program is reported to Transport for NSW on a quarterly basis.

- (4) and (5) Community transport providers are required to keep records of unmet need. Unmet need is reported by providers to Ageing, Disability and Home Care in the planning consultation process. The NSW Government is committed to ensure that data and information on unmet community need is collected and assessed on an ongoing basis.
