 - The Queensland border to be maintained as the line of defence for NSW with an effective buffer zone to be negotiated for the Tweed.
 - The West Report recommendation that on-property inspections be maintained, to be implemented.
 - An effective education programme needs to be put in place for both producers and DPI and RLPB staff.
 - Penalties for the deliberate movement of livestock from tick infested areas needs to realistically reflect the seriousness of the offence.

The recommendations made in the West report have been adopted by the government and have either already been implemented or are in the process of being implemented by NSW Department of Primary Industries.

I consider the current penalties for breaching livestock movement regulations appropriately reflect the seriousness of the offence.

Early detection of tick fever is an important issue. NSW DPI provides free laboratory testing for all notifiable diseases including tick fever and veterinarians ensure that appropriate samples are collected from all animal health investigations.

NSW DPI undertakes a range of initiatives to increase stockowner education concerning cattle tick issues.
