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\*1505 ASSISTED SCHOOL STUDENT TRANSPORT SCHEME—Mr Ryan Park asked the Minister for Education—

- (1) In each of the years from 2011 to 2015 (to 9 September 2015), how many students were eligible for the Assisted School Student Transport Scheme in:
- Illawarra;
  - Western Sydney;
  - Hunter;
  - Newcastle;
  - Far North Coast;
  - Far South Coast?

Answer—

The number of eligible students for each of these areas cannot be determined as they do not align with any previous or present education regions.

The Assisted School Travel Program allocates services based on transport areas. A copy of these transport areas can be found on the Department's NSW Public Schools website.

\*1506 TAFE DELIVERED VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING DISCRETE COURSES—Mr Anoulack Chanthivong asked the Minister for Regional Development, Minister for Skills, and Minister for Small Business—

Why has the Minister reduced funding to TAFE delivered vocational education and training (TVET) discrete courses such as Locomotive Detailing and Dismantling at Campbelltown TAFE and Community Services (Aged Care) at Macquarie Fields TAFE?

Answer—

- (1) There has been no reduction in the budget for TAFE-delivered Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Courses for 2016. Courses in Locomotive Detailing and Dismantling at Campbelltown TAFE and Community Services (Aged Care) at Macquarie Fields TAFE were offered via an expression of interest. There was insufficient interest in Locomotive Detailing and Dismantling at Campbelltown TAFE, and zero interest in Community Services (Aged Care) at Macquarie Fields TAFE. TAFE NSW has offered students alternative options and continually reviews courses for demand.

\*1507 SPECIALIST SERVICES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Mental Health, Minister for Medical Research, Assistant Minister for Health, Minister for Women, and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault—

- What specialist trauma counselling services are available in the Newcastle Local Government Area (LGA) and the Lake Macquarie LGA to women who have experienced domestic violence?
- What specialist trauma services exist for children and young people in the Wallsend electorate?
- What is the waiting time for access to services identified in (1) and (2)?

Answer—

I am advised:

Hunter New England Local Health District provides a range of services in the Wallsend, Newcastle and Lake Macquarie areas, including the Child Protection Counselling Service, Sexual Assault Service, Child and Family Health Team and First Steps Parenting service. All of these services are capable of supporting women and children affected by domestic violence when this is identified through assessment as one of the issues requiring clinical support and intervention.

A wide range of non-government organisations provide domestic violence services including the Newcastle Domestic Violence Resource Centre, Newcastle Family Support Service (Staying Home Leaving Violence) and Eastlakes Family Support (all part of Staying Home Leaving Violence), DOVE (Drive Out Violence, Eastlakes) and the Samaritans Domestic Violence Service. All women's refuges offer counselling, advocacy, support and case management.

The John Hunter Children's Hospital Child Protection Team is staffed by experienced allied health staff who provide crisis counselling and case management to children, young people and families who present

through John Hunter Hospital or John Hunter Children's Hospital where physical abuse or neglect is identified. The Senior Health Clinician on the Joint Investigative Response Team, provides crisis support and counselling within the context of the initial child protection and Police response.

The Hunter New England Local Health District Newcastle-based Sexual Assault Service, Rural New Street Program, Aboriginal Family Violence Worker and the Sexualised Behaviour Under 1 Os program provide services targeted at reducing trauma for children and young people, which may include the trauma of experiencing or witnessing domestic violence. The District's Specialist Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services also works with children and young people who experience moderate to severe mental health problems and their families and carers. All clients are triaged appropriately to ensure they receive care as quickly as possible based on their individual needs.

\*1510 PRIORITY ASSESSMENT PROCESS—Mr Anoulack Chanthivong asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—

What is involved in a 'priority assessment process' for staff wishing to join Service NSW? (reference LA Q.1113)

Answer—

As service centre outlets are being rolled out, staff are invited to join Service NSW through a priority assessment process. As Service NSW continues to refine the physical network design, it is ensuring all staff are appropriately informed so they have every opportunity to put their hands up if they wish to join Service NSW.

Impacted Roads and Maritime Services staff are considered Priority 1A when applying for jobs with Service NSW for any site they choose to apply for, from the date of the consolidation announcement. Priority 1A means staff are automatically put through for an interview. However, they are still considered on merit. They are also entitled to an assisted review in the Industrial Relations Commission (IRC) should they wish to seek redress.

Those who are not successful have opportunities for temporary redeployment in the registry network where required or voluntary redundancy.

The recruitment process was signed off by the Public Service Association (PSA) in the IRC in March 2013. This was confirmed through a round of hearings in the IRC in late 2014.

\*1511 FREE OPAL CARD—Mr David Harris asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

How many apprentices and trainees have taken up the free Opal Card?

Answer—

I am advised:

Apprentices and trainees eligible for a Concession Opal card can travel across the Opal footprint at half the price of an Adult Opal card fare.

- (5) How many injuries resulted in a P902 Incident Notification Form in the 2014-15 year on patrol?
- (6) As at 1 October 2015, how many police officers are 18 to 30 years old?
- (7) As at 1 October 2015, how many police officers are 30 to 40 years old?
- (8) As at 1 October 2015, how many police officers are 40 to 50 years old?
- (9) As at 1 October 2015, how many police officers are 50 years old or older?
- (10) As at 1 October 2015, how P902 forms were completed for 18-30 year olds?
- (11) As at 1 October 2015, how P902 forms were completed for 30 to 40 years olds?
- (12) As at 1 October 2015, how P902 forms were completed for 40 to 50 years olds?
- (13) As at 1 October 2015, how P902 forms were completed for those over 50 years old?

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Answer—

\*1513 NSW POLICE FORCE OPERATIONAL CAPACITY REPORTS—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for Justice and Police, Minister for the Arts, and Minister for Racing—

- (1) On what date were the following reports published on the NSW Police Force website ([https://www.police.nsw.gov.au/news/police\\_strength\\_and\\_operational\\_capacity](https://www.police.nsw.gov.au/news/police_strength_and_operational_capacity))?
  - (a) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 1 May 2015;
  - (b) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 12 December 2014;
  - (c) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 22 August 2014;
  - (d) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 2 May 2014;
  - (e) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 13 December 2013;
  - (f) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 23 August 2013;
  - (g) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 3 May 2013;
  - (h) NSW Police Force Operational Capacity report 14 December 2012;

- (2) Where are the NSW Police Force Operational Capacity reports prior to 4 May 2012 published?

Answer—

The Government announced its intention to introduce the publishing of operational capacity statistics on the NSW Police Force website in 2012. The first report detailed operational capacity as a percentage of authorised strength as at 4 May 2012. Subsequent reports are published three times a year following police attestations in May, August and December.

\*1514 LIGHT DETECTION AND RANGING DEVICES—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

Has the Government been provided with any legal advice which shows speeding offences issued using data from light detection and ranging (LIDAR) devices are still valid, despite recent revelations no valid certificates have been issued for LIDAR camera?

Answer—

I am advised:

That this is a matter for the Minister for Justice and Police.

\*1515 WESTCONNEX PROJECT—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) How many Development Applications have been lodged requesting permission to conduct work on the Westconnex Project outside usual building hours?
  - (a) How many of these applications were approved?
- (2) How many approximate hours of building will take place on this project outside usual building hours?

Answer—

I am advised:

Variations to hours when construction work can be carried out are regulated through the Conditions of Approvals and the Environmental Protection Licence. Some work will be undertaken on the motorway at night for safety reasons. Further information is available on the WestConnex website.

\*1516 MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENTS—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) How many motor vehicle accidents involved learner drivers in each of the following periods:
  - (a) 1 July 2012 to 30 June 2013;
  - (b) 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014;
  - (c) 1 July 2014 to 30 June 2015?

- (2) Of these accidents, how many involved learner drivers driving high performance cars, such as those banned for P1 and P2 drivers?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) (a) 1 July 2012 to 30 June 2013: 613 crashes out of a total of 40,897 (1.5 percent)\*  
 (b) 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014: 606 crashes out of a total of 39,824 (1.5 percent)\*  
 (c) 1 July 2014 to 30 June 2015: 409 crashes out of a total of 31,333 (1.3 percent)\*  
 (2) This detail is not available.

\*Due to changes to the reporting system, data for 2014-15 are not comparable with previous financial years.

- \*1517 CYCLE SAFETY ACTION PLAN 2014-15—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) What specific actions has the Government taken on the 37 Action Points and recommendations within the Cycle Safety Action Plan 2014-2015?  
 (2) How many Action Points have been fully implemented to date by the Government?  
 (3) When does the Government expect that all 37 Action Points will be fully implemented?

Answer—

I am advised :

The Cycling Safety Action Plan covers the period 2014-16. All actions are either complete or in progress. As many actions are long-term or ongoing, the Action Plan is designed to be implemented and then reviewed after the three year period.

- \*1518 TINK REVIEW INTO POLICE OVERSIGHT—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for Justice and Police, Minister for the Arts, and Minister for Racing—

- (1) On what date did the Government receive the Tink report into police oversight?  
 (2) When will the Government make the Tink review public?  
 (3) Will the Government be responding in detail to the report?  
 (a) If so, when will the Government announce their response?

Answer—

I refer the Member to my response to questions on this subject at the Budget Estimates Hearing on 3 September 2015.

- \*1519 NARCOTICS IN CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES—Ms Jodi McKay asked the Minister for Corrections, Minister for Emergency Services, and Minister for Veterans Affairs—

- (1) How many times has ice, speed and other methamphetamines been found in any New South Wales correctional facilities during each of the following periods:  
 (a) 1 July 2013 to 30 June 2014;  
 (b) 1 July 2014 to 30 June 2015?  
 (2) Of these incidents, how many occurred in corrective facilities which have a security classification of:  
 (a) Maximum;  
 (b) Medium;  
 (c) Minimum?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Corrective Services NSW Security Operations Group has found substances in powder form, including ice, speed and other methamphetamines, in correctional facilities:

- (1) (a) 1 July 2013 and 30 June 2014-109 times.  
 (b) 1 July 2014 and 30 June 2015-96 times.  
 (2) This data is not available. Many correctional centres hold inmates of more than one security classification. Drugs are also found in common areas of facilities which are accessed by all inmates and/or visitors.

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\*1521 INNER SYDNEY LIVE MUSIC VENUES—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for Justice and Police, Minister for the Arts, and Minister for Racing—

- (1) How many venues subject to the blanket Kings Cross and CBD 1.30am lockout (including venues that no longer operate) provide or provided live music or live entertainment?
- (2) How many of these venues have reduced staff since the commencement of the lockout?
- (3) How many of these venues have closed since the commencement of the lockout?
- (4) What assessment has the Government made on the impact of the 1.30am lockout on the provision of live music and live entertainment?
- (5) To what extent does the Government support a live music and live entertainment scene in inner Sydney?

Answer—

A statutory review of 1.30am lock outs and 3am cessation of liquor sales in the Sydney CBD Entertainment Precinct and Kings Cross Precinct is due to commence in 2016. Impacts of these measures will be considered as part of this review.

The Government provides direct support to the music sector through grants to music organisations, individuals and groups through the Arts and Cultural Development Program. Funding has been provided on a regular basis to organisations presenting festivals and events in Sydney and across NSW, as well as Music NSW, a peak body supporting the music industry. The NSW Government's Tourism and Major Events agency Destination NSW also supports a number of events that include live music and live entertainment.

\*1523 ADVERTISING ON BUSES—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) What complaints have been made about offensive advertising on buses over the past five years?
  - (a) What action was taken on these complaints?
- (2) What guidelines for advertising on Transport for NSW property and government buses does the Government impose?
- (3) How does the Government ensure that advertising contractors do not allow advertising on government buses that is sexist, racist, homophobic or transphobic?
- (4) What review mechanisms does the Government have in place to ensure compliance?
- (5) What penalties apply for breaches of advertising guidelines?
- (6) What plans does the Government have to review or update these guidelines and ensure that sexist, racist, homophobic or transphobic advertising is not permitted?

Answer—

I am advised:

Bus operators must ensure any advertising on a contract bus complies with advertising laws and codes of conduct. This is reviewed on a monthly basis. Noncompliance requires operators to remove the advertising item.

\*1524 SOLAR IN SCHOOLS—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Education—

- (1) What policies does the Government have about rooftop solar panels or solar hot water in New South Wales schools?
- (2) What assessment has the Government carried out about costs and benefits of these facilities to reduce school energy use and running costs?
- (3) What programs does the Government run to install or help schools install solar energy equipment?
- (4) What plans does the Government have to make it easier or cheaper for schools to have solar energy equipment?
- (5) What further action will the Government take to help schools achieve energy and cost savings with solar energy?

Answer—

(1) The Department of Education complies with the Government Resource Efficiency Policy to manage school energy use through various energy efficiency measures including the installation of solar panels.

(2) An assessment of the solar panels installed by the Department under its Resource Efficiency Program indicates that they are effective in reducing the cost of energy use in schools.

(3) and (4) The Department's Resource Efficiency Program includes the installation of solar systems in government schools. The Office of Environment and Heritage, with advice from the Department, is

currently developing a pre-qualified panel of Solar Purchase Agreement providers and a standardised contract to enable schools to implement solar systems with minimal upfront costs.

(5) The Department has a dedicated Environment and Sustainability Officer to assist government schools achieve energy and cost savings using various energy efficiency measures.

\*1525 SYDNEY HARBOUR FORESHORE AUTHORITY INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—

Given that the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority Interagency Committee will develop a vision and strategic plan for the Sydney Harbour foreshore and given the Government's commitment to open and transparent governance:

- (1) Why has a full list of representatives on the interagency committee not been made public?
- (2) Why have the terms of reference for the interagency committee not been made public?

Answer—

The inter-agency committee was established by Government in August 2014 to support and advise the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority (SHFA) Board to develop a strategic vision for the Sydney Harbour foreshore and review the functions of SHFA. The Committee comprised of members to bring together government agencies with an interest, representation included the Department of Premier and Cabinet, Department of Planning and the Department of Finance, Services and Innovation.

The work of the committee is now complete.

\*1528 CROWN LAND LEASES TO COUNCILS—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

- (1) How many Crown Land properties or parcels of land are leased to local government authorities in New South Wales?
- (2) How many were subject to rent increases in the last 12 months of:
  - (a) More than 50 percent;
  - (b) More than 100 percent;
  - (c) More than 200 percent;
  - (d) More than 300 percent?
- (3) What is the Government's policy for consulting with and notifying a local government authority before imposing a rent increase above 50 percent?
- (4) How often are rent levels assessed for readjustment?
- (5) What action is taken to prevent rent hikes of greater than 50 percent which could impact on a council's ability to plan financially?

Answer—

- (1) 74.
- (2) (a) 1
  - (b) 0
  - (c) 0
  - (d) 0
- (3) The Department of Primary Industries contacts any tenure holder subject to a rental increase of greater than 30 per cent prior to issue of the redetermination notice.
- (4) The period for rent re-determination is governed by the terms of the lease.
- (5) A phase-in period applies to rental increases of greater than 50 per cent.

\*1529 RUTHERFORD INDUSTRIAL ESTATE—Ms Jenny Aitchison asked the Minister for Health—

- (1) What statistics does the Government have regarding any health impacts from pollutants being released in the Rutherford Industrial Estate (known as the 'Rutherford Big Stink')?
- (2) What are the health impacts of the known contaminants that have been released?
- (3) What action is the Minister taking to deal with the public health issues?

Answer—

- (1) to (3) The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) conducted extensive testing and established that there were no airborne toxic compounds identified, although odours were present. While these odours may be considered unpleasant, they do not present a risk to public health. NSW Health



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promotes the reporting of odour complaints to the Environmental Protection Authority, which is the appropriate authority for the regulation of emissions associated with the estate.

\*1530 PADDINGTON BOWLING CLUB SITE—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

- (1) Do Crown Land leases prohibit making private profit out of Crown Land dedicated for a public purpose?
- (2) Does this prohibition apply to CSKS Holdings lease on the Paddington Bowling Club site?
- (3) What rent does CSKS Holdings pay for this lease?
- (4) Does CSKS Holdings pay \$52,000 per annum for the lease?
- (5) Did the Paddington Bowling Club pay more than \$500,000 in rent to CSKS Holding in 2015?
  - (a) If not, what amount was paid?
- (6) Does The Palms Tennis Centre pay \$44,000 per annum for the lease of tennis courts from CSKS Holdings?
  - (a) If not, what amount is paid?
- (7) What assessment has the Government made about whether the rent paid to CSKS Holdings by the Paddington Bowling Club and The Palms Tennis Centre breaches provisions of the lease or the Act?
- (8) Has the Government reviewed compliance with the lease or considered initiating lease forfeit clauses?
- (9) What further action will the Government take to ensure that this lease complies with the Crown Lands Act and lease conditions restricting it to use for public recreation?

Answer—

- (1) and (2) The terms and conditions of the lease and the provision/s of the Crown Lands Act that are being applied determine whether private profit can be derived from a lease.
- (2) to (4) Information on rentals paid under leases is considered commercial in confidence
- (5) to (6) This question should be directed to CSKS Holdings.
- (7) to (9) The Department will continue to monitor compliance with the lease.

Answer—

The Department of Family and Community Services (FACS) does not engage the NSW Trustee and Guardian to financially manage tenants with a history of rental arrears but works collaboratively with the NSW Trustee and Guardian to provide services to mutual clients.

\*1536 SOCIAL HOUSING WAITING LIST—Mr Tim Crakanthorp asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, and Minister for Social Housing—

What resources is the Government providing to manage the increase in the social housing waiting list, considering the pressures that issues such as the drug ice and domestic violence are putting on community and social housing?

Answer—

The Government is continuing to deliver better outcomes and experiences for vulnerable people requiring housing assistance, and grow the supply of social and affordable housing.

The Government continues to boost the supply of social and affordable housing through initiatives such as the recently announced Communities Plus development at Macquarie Park and six other sites across the State.

The Government has also announced a range of new measures to address current social issues such as drug use and domestic violence including an \$11 million election commitment to help those using the drug ice and a \$60 million initiative to help reduce domestic and family violence.
