*0820 LIVERPOOL COUNCIL AUDITOR—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Local Government—

- (1) Has Liverpool Council had the same auditor for two decades?
- (2) What is the Government's policy on the length of time audit contracts should be awarded in local government?

Answer—

Liverpool Council is responsible for the appointment of its external auditor and the question should be directed to Council for a response.

The Local Government Act 1993 requires that a council's auditor holds office for six years. Auditors may be appointed or re-appointed following a call for tenders and the consideration of the tenders.

*0823 FUNDING FOR MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES—Mr Ryan Park asked the Minister for Mental Health, Minister for Medical Research, Assistant Minister for Health, Minister for Women, and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault—

- (1) How much funding has the Government provided for mental health services in the Illawarra Shoalhaven Local Health District (LHD), including counselling, in each of the years from 2012 to 2015 (to 1 July 2015)?
- (2) How much funding is the Government planning to spend on mental health services in the Illawarra Shoalhaven LHD during 2016 and 2017?

*0825 DRUG TESTS IN THE WOLLONGONG LOCAL AREA COMMAND—Mr Ryan Park asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for Justice and Police, Minister for the Arts, and Minister for Racing—

- (1) How many roadside drug tests were carried out in the Wollongong Local Area Command (LAC) during 2014?
- (2) How many roadside drug tests have been carried out in the Wollongong LAC in 2015 (1 January 2015 to 5 August 2015)?
- (3) What additional resources are being provided to Wollongong LAC to combat the increase in drug use, particularly use of the drug 'ice'?

Answer—

The NSW Police Force has advised me the amount of roadside drug tests conducted by the Wollongong Local Area Command in conjunction with the Wollongong Drug Unit is increasing. The NSW Police Force regularly reviews the frequency of drug roadside testing to ensure it responds to operational needs.

In addition, the Wollongong LAC Target Action Group focuses on alleged offenders, and School Liaison Officers, with initiatives such as the 'My Choice' program, also do valuable and ongoing work in this area.

The Wollongong LAC receives additional support from specialist Commands including the State Crime Command, Police Transport Command and Traffic and Highway Patrol Command, whose officers conduct operations within the LAC in relation to illicit drug use.

The Wollongong LAC also works with a range of government and non-government organisations including Family and Community Services, the University of Wollongong and Wollongong Local Council to tackle issues of illicit drug use.

The NSW Government has also been consulting with police and health professionals to develop a multi-dimensional plan to target ice manufacturers and suppliers, while also addressing the needs of users and addicts.

The Government has made investments to combat increased ice use state wide for example by more than tripling the number of roadside drug tests to almost 100,000 a year by 2016-17 to crackdown on drug driving and halve the threshold required to charge dealers with possessing large commercial quantities.

- (2) Has the Deputy Premier been briefed on the increasing crime in Bellambi?
- (3) What plans does the Deputy Premier have to address vandalism in Bellambi?
- (4) What plans does the Deputy Premier have to address increasing drug use in Bellambi?
- (5) What plans does the Deputy Premier have to address increasing prevalence of domestic violence in Bellambi?

Answer—

The NSW Police Force has advised me:

Bureau of Crimes Statistics and Research (BOCSAR) is the official source of crime statistics. The Wollongong Local Area Command is working with other agencies including Wollongong City Council and Housing NSW to improve responses to criminal activity in Bellambi. This includes encouraging the community to report incidents, as well as considering ways to reduce the opportunity for crime through environmental design. An interagency approach is being taken to manage families at risk of domestic violence. Youth projects in local schools include information sessions, reading programs and police involvement in the Breakfast Program.

Also importantly to note, the Government is making on going investment in services and programs to prevent and respond to domestic and family violence. - (1) Who will be able to request information on an individual under the Government's Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme (DVDS)?
- (2) What offences will trigger an individual's inclusion in the DVDS?
- (3) What support will be offered to individuals who discover their partner has a history of domestic violence?
- (4) When and where will the pilot of this scheme commence?

Answer—

Details about the DVDS will be announced by the Government, shortly.

*0835 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Education—

- (1) What additional resources will be provided to teachers for the teaching of students about domestic violence, considering domestic violence will be included in the Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) Years 7-10 curriculum from 2016?
- (2) What additional training will be available to teachers for teaching students about domestic violence issues?
- (3) What additional support will be available for students who identify domestic violence in their families as a result of these programs?
 - (a) What additional support will be provided to schools in terms of teacher support and counsellors to assist students in these circumstances?

Answer—

- (1) The Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) has been part of a working party to develop a Domestic Violence Toolkit for schools. The working party includes:
 - (a) the National Association for Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect (NAPCAN).
 - (b) Youth Action.
 - (c) Domestic Violence NSW.

The toolkit will identify the most appropriate resources available including prevention programs, current research sourced from groups such as White Ribbon, and links to support services across New South Wales.

Teachers will be provided with access to resources used by the education sectors and other organisations to ensure that all schools in New South Wales are supported in teaching young people about domestic violence.

The toolkit will be available on the BOSTES website in Term 4, 2015 to assist schools with planning for integration of new content about domestic violence in 2016.

The BOSTES will also consult with stakeholders during 2015 to determine additional support materials that might be required to enhance PDHPE teachers' understanding of this important issue.

- (2) and (3) The Government has adopted a whole-of-government approach to preventing domestic and family violence. A part of this approach is including training modules in the Department of Education's annual Child Protection Update, which will specifically focus on identifying domestic and family violence issues. The annual training is mandatory for all school staff.

The Government recognises the need for an innovative, comprehensive approach to supporting the wellbeing of all students and recently released the Supported Students, Successful Students initiative. Over five years, this initiative will provide an increased investment of \$167.2 million and enhance by 45 percent the wellbeing services already being provided in New South Wales public schools.

This is the first significant enhancement of school counselling and wellbeing services in New South Wales public schools since 1996.

Every student in a public school has access to a school counsellor, including students who are impacted by domestic family violence. The Supported Students, Successful Students package includes \$80.7 million to employ 236 additional school counselling service positions, in addition to the 790 counsellor positions already in New South Wales public schools.

Supported Students, Successful Students underpins the new Wellbeing Framework for Schools. The Framework recognises the importance of a coordinated approach to the promotion of wellbeing in all students. The Framework will guide public schools as they respond to a range of issues experienced by children and young people, including those who experience mental health issues.

*0836 SHELLHARBOUR MOTOR REGISTRY—Ms Anna Watson asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—

Answer—

Service NSW offers a one-stop service offering more than 800 transactions from agencies across Government with extended trading hours.

The Shellharbour Motor Registry will be merged with the new Warrawong Service Centre due to open in late November 2015.

A digital store will be deployed in Shellharbour to help customers through the transition.

The Warrawong Service Centre will be located near the popular King Street shopping precinct and Westfield Shopping Centre and is easily accessible by private vehicle and public transport – with frequent bus connections every 15 minutes to Shellharbour.

Roads and Maritime Services has processes in place to encourage competitive tendering to get the best value for money for the people of New South Wales.

The use of Australian products is a commercial decision made by Companies delivering major road projects on behalf of Roads and Maritime Services. Roads and Maritime encourages its suppliers to source materials locally where possible.

Australian steel has been used for the majority of the Foxground and Berry bypass and the Gerringong upgrade, including steel produced by BlueScope.

Procurement of goods and services is undertaken in line with the New South Wales Government procurement guidelines. Australian-based companies are given every opportunity to tender for Government contracts through a fair and transparent process.

Roads and Maritime Services has processes in place to encourage competitive tendering to get the best value for money for the people of New South Wales.

The use of Australian products is a commercial decision made by companies delivering major road projects on behalf of Roads and Maritime Services. Roads and Maritime encourages its suppliers to source materials locally where possible.

The Foxground and Berry bypass used girders manufactured in Newcastle and Bendigo. There were no suppliers in the Illawarra with the required Roads and Maritime pre-qualification to manufacture precast girders for this project.

Concrete, aggregates and asphalt from the Illawarra region were used to construct the Foxground and Berry bypass.

Answer—

The Government is committed to a disability service system that increases choice and control for people with disability. For this reason, in December 2012 the Government became the first state to sign a historic agreement with the Commonwealth to implement the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS).

In March 2015, the Government committed to an early transition of the NDIS in the Nepean Blue Mountains area for children and young people with disability aged 0-17 years. This decision, in agreement with the Commonwealth Government, will allow the delivery of supports including early intervention services for around 2,000 children and young people by 30 June 2016.

As the NDIS is implemented in the Nepean Blue Mountains it will interface with other service systems such as health, education, housing and transport, to enable people with disability to participate socially and economically in their community.

Governments, through the Council of Australian Governments (COAG), have agreed to a set of principles that define the interface of the NDIS with mainstream agencies. These principles are outlined in the document: NDIS - Principles to Determine the Responsibilities of the NDIS and Other Service Systems, Which is available online on the

COAG website.

The Government will continue to fund or deliver mainstream services such as health, education, housing and transport, including in the Nepean Blue Mountains area, as the

NDIS is being implemented and once it is fully implemented in 2018.

- Does the Government have plans to close Service NSW's Belmont Registry, located at the corner of Walter and Macquarie Streets, Belmont?
- Answer—
- Service NSW was established in 2013 to deliver on the Government's commitment to improve customer service and make access to government transactions easier for the residents and businesses of NSW.
- As part of this commitment, Service NSW is meeting the growing customer appetite to complete transactions online and serve people as quickly as possible through our website, mobile app and 24/7 phone service. This is complemented by one-stop shops which are located across the state with extended trading hours and access to more services.
- The Warners Bay Service Centre has been in operation since late June and up to 18 August has served around 14,000 customers with average wait times of under five minutes and customer satisfaction scores of 98 per cent. It offers customers extended trading hours and the ability to handle an increased number of transactions, including offering a greater number of driving tests to meet customer demand from a wider region. Customers can access a wealth of other transactions beyond traditional motor registry services such as Seniors Card applications, Housing NSW payments, Fair Trading licences, birth certificate applications and many more.
- Accordingly, the services at the Belmont Motor Registry will relocate to the Warners Bay one-stop shop by mid-October. A new mobile service will be offered to customers on modified or restricted licences to support them through this transition.
