Given that there was an error when rezoning Cessnock Local Government Area LEP 2011 to RU5 Village:

- (1) How long will owners have to wait for the error to be rectified and considered by the Department of Planning?
- (2) Will the Department of Planning expedite the process?
- (3) Will the Department of Planning re-exhibit for public consultation?
- (4) Will the Department of Planning need to re-assess and go through the whole process, just to change the lot size map?

Answer-

- (1) Cessnock City Council resolved at its meeting on 1 August 2012 to amend the LEP to reduce the minimum lot size from 40 hectares to 750 square metres for certain land at Millfield. An amendment to the lot size for this land was never proposed or submitted to the department in the preparation of the Cessnock LEP 2011.
- (2) Once the department received council's proposal it will be progressed as quickly as possible.
- (3) The proposed amendment has not been publicly exhibited. Suitable exhibition requirements will be addressed in a Gateway Determination.
- (4) The proposed amendment has not previously been considered by the department.

With regard to industrial facilities which release pollution to air, water and soil:

- (1) What consideration has the Government given to setting limits for cumulative amounts of pollution for the State, and at catchment and site levels?
- (2) To what extent does the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) consider cumulative pollution impacts as part of individual assessments of pollution licence applications?
- (3) What consideration has the Government given to requiring the EPA to reject pollution licence applications if an applicant is unable to demonstrate that there will be no net degradation of the quality of the receiving environment?
- (4) To what extent is it lawful for a facility to discharge pollutants without authorisation of a pollution licence?
- (5) How does the EPA require industry to continuously conform with best technological improvements to reduce pollution?
- (6) How are pollution licences suspended when prescribed emission levels are exceeded?

Answer—

- (1) The consideration of cumulative impacts from industry is reflected in environmental protection and land use planning legislation and policies.
- (2) Cumulative impacts are one of a range of factors considered by the EPA in making licensing decisions in accordance with section 45 of the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997 (POEO Act).
- (3) Matters to be taken into consideration by the EPA in exercising its licensing functions are specified in section 45 of the POEO Act.
- (4) Pollution offences, as well as defences, exceptions and exclusions, are set out in the POEO Act.
- (5) The EPA uses a number of approaches to ensure regulated industry is implementing appropriate measures to minimise their impacts on the environment. This includes:
 - Setting appropriate environmental performance standards (which consider available pollution abatement technology and cost-effectiveness) at the licence application stage and when significant licence variations are made;
 - Regular reviews of legislation, policies and requirements consider improvements in technology and best practice pollution control;
 - The application of pollution reduction programs to drive environmental improvements; and
 - The pollutant load-based licensing scheme which provides a financial incentive for environment protection licensees to improve their environmental performance beyond specific licence requirements.
- (6) The EPA considers a range of factors in determining what action to take for licence non-compliances, including the seriousness of the breach and level and extent of environmental impact. A licence suspension is one possible tool available to the EPA and the requirements are set out in Part 3.7 of the POEO Act.
