#### **16 FEBRUARY 2016**

\*2178 BUILDING PROFESSIONALS ACT—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation—

When will the Government respond to the Lambert Report on the review of the Building Professionals Act?

Answer—

Section 97 of the Building Professionals Act 2005 requires that a report on the outcome of the statutory review of the Act be tabled in each House of Parliament before the beginning of December 2016.

- \*2182 STRATA OWNERS AND TENANTS—Ms Julia Finn asked the Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation—
  - (1) What education campaign will be undertaken to ensure strata owners and tenants are aware of their rights under the provisions of the Strata Schemes Management Bill 2015 and the Strata Schemes Development Bill 2015?
  - (2) What legal assistance will be made available by the Department of Fair Trading to owners who may object to the sale of their home under the new collective sale provisions?
  - (3) What estimate has been made of the number of collective sales to be sought in the first year of operation of the new provisions?

Answer-

(1) A comprehensive public education and awareness campaign to help strata communities prepare for the more than 90 changes to the strata schemes legislation is being developed and finalised.

Communication activities will target some two million lot owners, renters and industry professionals in NSW to inform them of their rights and responsibilities under the new laws. The campaign will include implementation of a peer-reviewed advertising campaign in line with requirements for NSW Government communications.

Primary target audiences identified include NSW residents in approximately 75,000 strata schemes (including tenants and lot owners), landlords (renting out strata-titled property) and owner-investors (who may not live in NSW). Other targeted groups comprise strata professionals including NSW licensed strata managing agents, office-bearers in strata schemes, real estate agents, relevant advocacy groups, industry associations, property developers and builders.

Currently, the NSW Fair Trading website has a series of web pages, facts sheets and frequently asked questions which cover various aspects of the reforms, including an overview of management reforms, strata managing agent reforms, by-law reforms, managing disputes, and the new collective sale and strata renewal reforms. These web pages and fact sheets will be continually updated to ensure comprehensive but readily understood information is made available to all stakeholders. Fair Trading will continue to liaise with key stakeholders for feedback to ensure that the campaign meets their audiences' needs.

(2) Fair Trading will establish a Collective Sale Advice and Advocacy Program consisting of a hotline to assist and advise owners and tenants and provide referrals to relevant organisations such as Housing NSW, the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS), Tenants Union and the NSW Law Society.

Elderly and vulnerable owner-occupiers will have access to free legal advice and assistance to support them. Information and basic advice will be provided and referrals made to specialist advisers, such as accountants and financial planners, to assist dissenting owners with Court preparations.\

- (3) The number of collective sales in the first year of operation of the new provisions will be determined by strata owners and owners corporations, and will be subject to particular offers to the scheme by potential purchasers.
- \*2190 FISHING BANS—Mr Tim Crakanthorp asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

Was the introduction of fishing bans by the NSW Environment Protection Authority, following the Williamtown RAAF contamination, obstructed by the Federal Department of Defence?

Answer—

There is no evidence of any obstruction by Department of Defence in any way regarding commercial fishing closures in Fullerton Cove and Tilligerry Creek.

- \*2193 WORKERS COMPENSATION AMENDMENT ACT 2015—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation—
  - (1) When will the following provisions of the Workers Compensation Amendment Act 2015 commence:
    - (a) Schedule 2 [2] to [14] [16] [17] [19] [20];
    - (b) Schedule 3 [4];
    - (c) Schedule 4?

#### Answer-

- (1) (a) The provisions of Schedule 2 [2] to [14 (except clause 44BF)] [16] [19] [20] commenced on 4 December 2015. The provisions of Section 2 [14 Clause 44BF] and Schedule 2 [17] have been the subject of consultation to ensure the correct regulatory framework is developed to support implementation. It is anticipated that the Regulations will be in place prior to 30 June 2016.
- (b) The provisions of Schedule 3 [4] commenced on 4 December 2015.
- (c) The provisions of Schedule 4 Have been the subject of consultation to ensure the correct regulatory framework is developed to support implementation. Consultation has now closed with a summary of responses published in December 2015. It is anticipated the Regulation will be in place prior to 30 June 2016
- \*2194 WORKERS COMPENSATION ACT 2015—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Minister for Innovation and Better Regulation—
  - (1) What is the amount of money saved for every day in which the following sections of the Workers Compensation Act 2015 are not in force:
    - (a) Schedule 2 [2] to [14] [16] [17] [19] [20];
    - (b) Schedule 3 [4];
    - (c) Schedule 4?

#### Answer-

(1) Schedule 2 [2] to [14] (except clause 44BF) [16] [19] [20] and Schedule 3 [4] commenced on 4 December 2015. These sections applied retrospectively to October 2012 providing benefits to injured workers regardless of when the sections commenced.

The State Insurance Regulatory Authority (SIRA) is unable to provide a cost estimate related to the Regulations which arise from Schedule 2 [14] clause 44BF, [17] and Schedule 4.

- \*2217 POSTAL CHARGES FOR THE TREASURY—Mr Edmond Atalla asked the Treasurer, and Minister for Industrial Relations—
  - (1) How much extra money is required by the Department of Treasury to cover the cost of the 43 percent increase in postal charges, which commenced on 4 January 2016?
  - (2) Has the Department applied for a budget supplement to cover this increase in administration costs?
    - (a) If not, from what programmes are funds being diverted to cover these costs?

# Answer-

Individual postal charges for each item dispatched vary and are contingent on size, weight and intended destination, as well as other possible variables. Postal charges continue to be met from within existing administrative budgets.

\*2256 PELICAN MARINA—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy representing the Minister for Primary Industries, and Minister for Lands and Water—

With reference to the Pelican Marina collapse:

- (1) Was the Minister aware of the letter sent in January 2015 by Lake Macquarie City Council to the Department of Primary Industry- Lands, which warned those working and visiting the marina that their safety was at risk?
  - (a) What actions were taken by the Department after receiving the letter?
- (2) What is the Department's procedure in addressing such urgent notices?
- (3) Will the Minister visit the site and speak to the affected tenants and business owners?
- (4) Will the Minister release the structural assessment report carried out by the NSW Public Works in December 2015?

### Answer-

(1) No.

- (a) At the time of the letter, the marina complex was held under Lease and the responsibility for managing the site rested with the former operator.
- (2) The letter from Council was not a notice.
- (3) The Department of Primary Industries- Lands has been in regular contact with the occupants and has been supporting them through this difficult time. Parliamentary Secretary for the Hunter, Scot Macdonald visited the site on Monday 15 February 2016 to discuss the issues regarding the deconstruction with staff from DPI Lands and affected occupants.
- (4) The release of this report is currently being considered.

- \*2263 SERVICE NSW OFFICES—Mr David Mehan asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—
  - (1) How many state electorates in New South Wales will not have a full Service NSW office within their bounds?
  - (2) What state electorates are they?

Answer-

Between July 2013 and December 2015, Service NSW has operated 51 service centres complemented by other points of presence such as digital stores. I am advised sites for the Service NSW physical network are assessed on current and future population growth corridors, changing customer demand, operational requirements and site suitability.

\*2264 GOSFORD SERVICE NSW CENTRE—Mr David Mehan asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—

With regards to the Service NSW one-stop shop located on Henry Parry Drive, Gosford:

- (1) How many transactions have been conducted (on a monthly basis) since the office opened?
- (2) How many of the following transactions have been conducted (on a monthly basis) since the office opened:
  - (a) Driver Licence renewals:
  - (b) Car registration renewals;
  - (c) Birth certificate applications;
  - (d) NSW Housing rental payments?

#### Answer-

- (1) From October 2013 to February 2016, the Gosford Service Centre conducted approximately 8,100 transactions per month.
- (2) Each month the Gosford Service Centre conducted approximately:
  - (a) 1060 driver licence renewals;
  - (b) 1365 vehicle registration renewals;
  - (c) 115 birth certificate applications; and
  - (d) 5 Housing NSW transactions.
- \*2265 LICENSED DRIVERS—Mr David Mehan asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—
  - (1) How many licensed drivers (car, motorcycle and modified) live in the following postcodes:
    - (a) 2250;
    - (b) 2258;
    - (c) 2260;
    - (d) 2261?

### Answer-

This information is on the Roads and Maritime Services website.

\*2266 FLASHING LIGHTS AT CHARLESTOWN EAST PUBLIC SCHOOL—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure representing the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight, and Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) Flashing lights are proven to reduce speeding in school zones. In light of this when will these signs be installed at all entrances to schools not only main school entry points?
- (2) The Government's Transport for NSW website states that flashing lights cover the 'main school entry point.' Is the Minister aware that at Charlestown East Public School the flashing lights are located on Dudley Road and not Bula Street, the main school entry point?
- (3) Will the Minister investigate the current location of the flashing lights at Charlestown East Public School?

#### Answer-

The NSW Government has announced it will invest \$5 million to install a second set of flashing lights outside at least 400 schools in NSW with a second busy entrance. Charlestown East Public School will be considered as part of this program.

With regards to the 'Fig of Tobruk' at Hurlstone Agricultural High School Glenfield, will this living memorial be transplanted to the proposed new site at Hawkesbury or will it be left at Glenfield?

Answer—

The Department of Education is in consultation with the school community, the Returned and Services League of Australia and Campbelltown City Council regarding significant memorial considerations relating to the project.

\*2270 HURLSTONE AGRICULTURAL HIGH SCHOOL SITE BILL 2009—Mr Anoulack Chanthivong asked the Minister for Education—

Does the Minister still support the Objects of the Hurlstone Agricultural High School Site Bill 2009?

Answer-

This Government supports a strong future focussed agricultural education provision in the Sydney region.

Answer-

  - (3) How many incidents reported to NSW Police at the Flemington Local Area Command involved assault and the theft of a mobile phone or intimidation and the theft of a mobile phone in each of the years from 2012 to 2015?

- \*2283 COORDINATING AND MONITORING COMMITTEE—Ms Anna Watson asked the Minister for Planning—
  - (1) Has the Government established the Coordinating and Monitoring Committee mentioned on page 13 of the Illawarra-Shoalhaven Regional Plan published on 24 November 2015?

### Answer—

- (1) The first meeting of the Committee will be at the end of April 2016. The terms of reference, meeting procedures and ongoing venue of the Committee will be discussed at the Committee's inaugural meeting.
- (2) An Annual Monitoring Report will be publically released once the Plan has been in effect for at least 12 months.
- \*2284 RENEWABLE ENERGY ECONOMY—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Industry, Resources and Energy—

The Australian Energy Regulator's State of the Energy Market 2015 report provides insight into the beginnings of a stagnant fossil fuel economy in the Hunter, NSW, and Australia in general.

- (1) With a view to ensuring no job losses or downturns in industry take place in the near future, particularly in the Wallsend electorate, has the Minister reviewed the wealth of literature available from industry analysts and economists on models for a transition to a renewable energy economy?
- (2) If so, has this information influenced any policy the Minister intends to introduce?

### Answer-

- (1) Yes. The NSW Government recognises the vast potential of the Hunter and is committed to supporting the region's continued growth. Through projects supported by the Office of Regional Development, the NSW Government has secured over \$537 million in investment in the Hunter region, and attracted over 2,500 jobs, since 2011. Information about regional development in NSW is available at http://www.industry.nsw.gov.au/invest-in-nsw/regional-opportunities.The NSW Government has also provided funding to support the Hunter Energy Transition Alliance. The Alliance will consult in the Hunter region and seek to identify future jobs and opportunities for new energy investment and skills development. Information about the Hunter Energy Transition Alliance is available via http://www.energyinnovation.net.au/projects/energy-transition-alliance-for-the-hunter-valley.
- (2) The NSW Government remains committed to a reliable, affordable and clean energy future for NSW. The NSW Renewable Energy Action Plan has been in place since 2013, with 12 of the 24 actions already completed.

In 2014 the renewable energy sector supported 14,800 jobs in NSW, and in 2014/15 three large-scale generation projects were completed, totalling 380 megawatts of capacity. The share of electricity generation from solar, wind and bioenergy sources in NSW has more than doubled over the past four years.

Answer\_
