- *9531 INCREASE OF FUNDING FOR FAMILY AND COMMUNITY SERVICES—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, Minister for Social Housing, and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault—
 - (1) Considering a year ago the NSW Ombudsman tabled an inquiry into the operation of the Joint Investigation Response Team which recommended increased funding for Family and Community Services (FACS) to ensure the Department can 'keep up' with Police correspondence, to what extent has the Department addressed this recommendation?
 - (2) How much increased funding has FACS received in response to this recommendation?

Answer-

I am advised the Department of Family and Community Services (FACS) improved the capacity of the Joint Investigation Response Team (JIRT) - a state-wide tri-agency program consisting of FACS, Police and Health - by establishing additional JIRT caseworker teams at Coffs Harbour, Newcastle and Wollongong. These teams will help to improve FACS' capacity to respond jointly with partner agencies to vulnerable children and young people in a timely and coordinated approach.

I am further advised that during 2017-18 FACS budgeted \$18.0 million for JIRT, an increase of almost \$2.0 million from the previous financial year. This funding supports 105 caseworkers and eight case support workers.

- *9532 HILLSBOROUGH ROAD, MACQUARIE ROAD AND MEDCALF STREET ROUNDABOUT—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—
 - (1) How many members of the public have contacted Roads and Maritime Services regarding the Hillsborough Road/Macquarie Road/Medcalf Street roundabout since January 2015 (to 16 October 2018)?
 - (a) As a result of these representations, how many site visits have been conducted by Roads and Maritime Services at the intersection during peak traffic times?
 - (i) On what dates did these site visits occur?
 - (ii) What actions have been undertaken to resolve congestion issues at the roundabout as a result of these site visits?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) Approximately 15 members
- (a) Roads and Maritime Services has completed a number of site visits in relation to the mid-block pedestrian lights installed just to the east of the intersection.

Roads and Maritime is investigating Hillsborough Road as a location identified in the draft Lake Macquarie Transport Strategy.

*9533 EXPERT EVIDENCE GIVEN ON BEHALF OF THE HEALTH CARE COMPLAINTS COMMISSION—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

Has the psychiatrist who was allocated the pseudonym 'Brian' by the Coroner conducting the Inquest into the Lindt Cafe Siege undertaken any consultation work or given expert evidence on behalf of the Health Care Complaints Commission?

Answer-

I am advised that the name of the psychiatrist is subject to a suppression order. The Commission does not have knowledge of the identity of this practitioner and does not have a means to clarify whether consultation work has been undertaken for or expert evidence given on behalf of the Commission.

- *9534 FINALISATION OF DRAFT CORRIDOR STRATEGY AND TRANSPORT STUDY—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—
 - (1) When will the final Warners Bay to Charlestown Draft Corridor Strategy be released?
 - (2) When will the final Lake Macquarie Transport Study be released?

Answer-

I am advised:

The Warners Bay to Charlestown Draft Corridor Strategy has been consolidated into the Lake Macquarie Network Strategy. Roads and Maritime Services is working with Transport for NSW to finalise the Lake Macquarie Transport Strategy.

*9535 COMMUNITY TRANSPORT FOR THE WANSEY DIALYSIS CENTRE—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

What community transport is available to Wansey Dialysis Centre patients?

Answer-

I am advised:

Transport for NSW provides the Community Transport Program and the Community Home Support Program for people with limited transport options.

- *9536 PACIFIC HIGHWAY UPGRADES AT HIGHLANDS—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—
 - (1) On what date will construction begin to upgrade the Pacific Highway and Kahibah Road, Highfields intersection?
 - (2) On what date will construction begin on the Pacific Highway and Northcott Drive, Highfields intersection?

Answer-

I am advised:

Timing for the start of construction will depend on the extent of community feedback in response to the Review of Environmental Factors, which is expected to be displayed with the concept design in coming months.

*9537 PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATIONS INTO THE LOWER HUNTER FREIGHT CORRIDOR RAIL LINE—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

On what date will the outcomes of the preliminary investigations into the Lower Hunter Freight Corridor rail line be publicised?

Answer-

I am advised:

The Lower Hunter Freight Corridor is being designed to provide essential rail capacity for passenger and freight train growth across the broader rail network by increasing the efficiency and reliability of the rail network by separating freight and passenger rail services.

Transport for NSW are currently undertaking preliminary investigations to assess options for the Lower Hunter Freight Corridor. When the technical investigations are complete, Transport for NSW will consult with the community and stakeholders about the Lower Hunter Freight Corridor.

- *9538 HILLSBOROUGH ROAD/CHADWICK STREET INTERSECTION—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—
 - (1) How many members of the public have contacted Roads and Maritime Services regarding the Hillsborough Road/ Chadwick Street intersection since January 2015 (to 16 October 2018)?
 - (a) As a result of these representations, how many site visits have been conducted by Roads and Maritime Services at the intersection during peak traffic times?
 - (i) On what dates did these site visits occur?
 - (ii) What actions have been undertaken to resolve congestion issues at the roundabout as a result of these site visits?

Answer-

I am advised:

- (1) Roads and Maritime Services has been contacted by members of the public. Precise figures are not available.
- (a) Roads and Maritime Services staff, including the Director of Hunter Region, have completed inspections at the intersection various times and met with members of the community.

Roads and Maritime Services is investigating Hillsborough Road as a key location identified in the draft Lake Macquarie Transport Strategy.

Bollards were installed along Hillsborough Road to deter entry/exit issues from the showground that impact the Hillsborough Road/Chadwick Street intersection.

I am advised:

Roads and Maritime Services is investigating the intersection as a location identified in the draft Lake Macquarie Transport Strategy.

*9540 WORKS TO WIDEN HILLSBOROUGH ROAD—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

On what date will construction begin to widen Hillsborough Road to four lanes between Warners Bay and the Newcastle Inner City Bypass?

Answer—

I am advised:

Timing of the construction of the widening of Hillsborough Road is dependent on a number of factors including further planning, environment approvals, weather and final business case.

- *9541 RESPONSE TO CORRESPONDENCE—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, Minister for Social Housing, and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault—
 - (1) Do you propose to reply to the letter to yourself from Melita Bramman dated 7 July 2018?
 - (a) If so, when?
 - (b) If not, why not?
 - (2) Do you propose to reply to my letter to you on behalf of Melita Bramman dated 13 July 2018?
 - (a) If so, when?
 - (b) If not, why not?

Answer-

I am advised both letters have been replied to.

- *9542 REVIEW INTO THE ROYAL PREROGATIVE OF MERCY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—
 - (1) Has the review into the Royal Prerogative of Mercy been finalised?
 - (a) If so, when and how will the report be released?
 - (b) If not, why not?

Answer-

On 9 November 2018, I announced a new policy to guide the release of information relating to petitions for the exercise of the Royal Prerogative of Mercy and applications for review of conviction or sentence submitted under section 76 of the Crimes (Appeal and Review) Act 2001, which is publicly available at www.justice.nsw.gov.au.

This policy was developed following public consultation and the completion of a review undertaken by the Office of General Counsel, Department of Justice.

- *9543 PRESUMED DEATH AND MURDER OF LYNETTE DAWSON—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—
 - (1) Considering the recusal of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) in relation to issues arising from the presumed death and murder of Lynette Dawson, why were the brief and related considerations not referred to interstate counsel?

- (a) Was consideration ever given to an interstate referral as suggested in (1) above?
- (2) What protocols are in place in relation to considerations by the Office of the DPP of the brief concerning the presumed death and murder of Lynette Dawson if a Deputy Director needs to seek advice that would normally be sought from the Director?

Answer-

I am advised:

Under section 33 of the Director of Public Prosecutions Act 1986, the Director of Public Prosecutions has delegated the authority to exercise all the powers of the Director, except the non-delegable power of delegation, to the three current Deputy Directors of Public Prosecutions. This allows each Deputy Director of Public Prosecutions to exercise the powers of the Director, when required, in accordance with the Prosecution Guidelines of the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions for New South Wales.

Consequently, consideration of an interstate referral given the recusal of the Director of Public Prosecutions in the Lynette Dawson matter was unnecessary.

- *9544 RECOMMENDATION 17 OF THE LINDT CAFE SIEGE INQUEST—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—
 - (1) Pursuant to Recommendation 17 by the Coroner who conducted the Inquest into the Lindt Cafe Siege, has an expert panel been appointed in lieu of the Psychiatrist who was allocated the pseudonym 'Brian' by the Coroner?
 - (a) If so:
 - (i) How many members of the panel are there?
 - (ii) What is the particular expertise of each panel member?
 - (iii) What was the selection criteria for membership of the panel?
 - (iv) Who comprised the selection panel to approve the members?
 - (v) Were applicants for membership of the panel interviewed?
 - (vi) How were the positions on the panel advertised?

Answer—

I am advised:

The NSW Police Force (NSWPF) has established a network of specialists who are subject matter experts in their particular discipline and these resources can be used when required.

Following the Inquest, the NSWPF has expanded the number of advisers it accesses and the range and breadth of disciplines it consults in relation to negotiations. The NSWPF and NSW Health have established a Memorandum of Understanding which allows the NSWPF to have direct access to NSW Health resources.

*9545 EXPERT EVIDENCE GIVEN ON BEHALF OF THE NSW POLICE—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

Has the psychiatrist who was allocated the pseudonym 'Brian' by the Coroner conducting the inquest into the Lindt Cafe siege continued to consult, undertake any consultation work or given expert evidence on behalf of the NSW Police since the Coroner's report was released?

Answer—

I am advised:

The NSW Police Force Negotiation Unit has not consulted with 'Brian' in any capacity since the report was released.

- *9546 JURY DUTY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—
 - (1) What is your response to the view of the Industrial Relations Commission expressed in a case involving an application by Jennifer Shand that jury duty is not a public activity?
 - (2) What action will you take to provide effective protection for jurors who are victimised for performing jury duty?

Answer-

I am advised:

The Jury Act 1977 (the Jury Act) provides protections that prevent the unlawful dismissal of an employee on the basis that that employee has been summoned to serve jury duty. Under section 69 of the Jury Act,

an employer who dismisses or injures a person in their employment, or alters that person's position to their prejudice because they are summoned to serve as a juror may be guilty of an offence. This offence carries a maximum penalty of 200 penalty units for corporations or 50 penalty units and 12 months

imprisonment for individuals.

The Industrial Relations Commission in Jennifer Shand v Secretary of the Department of Transport [2018] NSWIRComm 1055 determined that jury duty is not a 'public or political activity' for the purposes of section 210(1) (h) of the Industrial Relations Act 1996 (IR Act). The IR Act falls within the portfolio responsibility of the Minister for Industrial Relations.

*9547 RESOURCING LEVELS IN COURTS—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—

What is your response to the concerns of Justice Judith Kelly recently elected President of the Judicial Conference of Australia on 10 October 2018 concerning resourcing levels in Courts?

Answer-

The Government recognises the vital role performed by our courts and judicial officers. Judicial officers in New South Wales are supported by a dedicated 24 hour counselling service which is available to all judicial officers and their families through the Judicial Assistance Program.

In 2016, the Government committed \$86 million for the District Court to fund additional resources, including the appointment of five extra District Court judges, and new case management measures aimed at reducing workload pressures.

In October 2018, I announced an additional funding package of almost \$150 million that will fund the appointment of seven additional District Court judges, as well as additional Crown Prosecutors and senior lawyers at Legal Aid NSW.

The District Court will soon have a full-time employee equivalent of 75 permanent judges, the highest number on record.

I have also announced a further \$4.1 million of additional funding for the Local Court which will increase Local Court capacity by two extra magistrates in 2019 as part of a \$127 million package to implement the recommendations from the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse.

What is the delay in a relative obtaining post mortem reports in relation to deaths reported to the Coroner?

Answer—

Timeframes for final coronial post-mortem reports vary depending on the nature and complexity of each case, type of tests required, directions from the Coroner and police involvement.

Considering the State Heritage Register Committee recommended State Heritage listing for the Chinese Garden of Friendship (SHR No. 02017) on 1 August 2018 and you delivered your decision to accept that recommendation on 5 October 2018, can you explain the delay in your decision to list an extension of the curtilage of Varroville (SHR No. 00737) on the State Heritage Register, as recommended by the State Heritage Register Committee on 28 September 2017?

Answer_

On 12 October 2018, I referred the Heritage Council of NSW's recommendation to list the extended curtilage of Varroville to the Independent Planning Commission for review under section 36 of the Heritage Act 1977.
