Answer—

NSW Special Envoys were appointed in 2016/2017 to advance the Government's trade and investment agenda and strengthen relationships with businesses and government leaders in priority international markets. Under Global NSW, the NSW Government is adopting a revised approach to external counsel on the State's trade, investment and international initiatives. Accordingly, there are currently no Envoys performing duties.
