Answer—

The current Acting Principal at Bondi Public School will remain at the school until a substantive Principal commences. The Principal position, Bondi Public School, was readvertised on 22 July 2020. Applications are still open and close on 5 August 2020. Agreed panel processes will be undertaken.

\*1689 EDUCATION AND EARLY CHILDHOOD LEARNING—SCHOOL PLANNING—Mrs Houssos asked the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning—

- (1) What are the current projections for how many new public primary and secondary schools will be built between now and 2031?
  - (a) What is the total projected capacity?
- (2) The Education Department agreed to the Auditor General's 2017 recommendation to publish detailed information on the status of assets, current and projected school enrolments and planned school projects, where is each part of that information?

Answer—

- (1) The Department of Education's long term projections are informed by census data and dwelling and population projections provided by the Department of Planning, Industry and Environment in conjunction with local councils. The Department reviews the demographic need for school facilities on a continual basis. These projections align with the NSW Government's endorsed 2016 Common Planning Assumptions.
  - (a) Every eligible student who wishes to attend a NSW government school will be given a place at their local school. Accordingly, the Department does not have fixed enrolment capacities at NSW government schools.
- (2) The Department regularly publishes information on its program of work responding to the State's once in a generation population growth on the School Infrastructure NSW website. The Department endeavours to ensure the accuracy and currency of information provided.

\*1690 COUNTER TERRORISM AND CORRECTIONS—PROFESSIONAL AND FAMILY VISITS FOR PRISONERS—Ms Jackson asked the Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning representing the Minister for Counter Terrorism and Corrections—

(Can the Minister provide the time-frame and details for the return of professional and family visits for prisoners in New South Wales?

Answer—

I am advised:

In-person social visits remain suspended at this point in time due to the ongoing risk of community transmission and entry of COVID-19 in the correctional environment. Corrective Services NSW (CSNSW) will continue to review the existing arrangements, however, there is no set date as to when restrictions will be eased.

Professional visits to inmates have dramatically reduced and been replaced with telephone and Audio Visual Link visits. Unless there are exceptional circumstances, all face to face visits to prisons by Legal Counsel have been suspended.

Decisions to relax or remove any of the measures that CSNSW has implemented will be informed by expert advice and the need to ensure safe and secure CSNSW facilities.
