- (1) Under the extraordinary powers granted to the Minister under the COVID-19 Legislation Amendment (Emergency Measures) Bill 2020, Division 5 Regulation-making power for exceptional circumstances, which regulations have been made by the Minister?
- (a) For what purpose were these regulations made?
  - (b) What are the relevant details for each regulation?

Answer—

The COVID-19 Legislation Amendment (Emergency Measures) Act 2020 (repealed) inserted a new 'Part 5 Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic' into the Criminal Procedure Act 1986, including a new regulation making power in s 366 of Division 5 of Part 5 to Criminal Procedure Act 1986. No regulations have been made under s 366.

\*1182 PLANNING AND PUBLIC SPACES—COVID-19 - MINISTERIAL DECISIONS—Mr Latham asked the Minister for Mental Health, Regional Youth and Women representing the Minister for Planning and Public Spaces—

- (1) Under the extraordinary powers granted to the Minister under the COVID-19 Legislation Amendment (Emergency Measures) Bill 2020, 2.8 Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 No 203, what Ministerial orders have been made?
- (a) For what purpose was each order made?
  - (b) What are the relevant details for each order?

Answer—

I am advised:

As at 14 April 2020, six orders have been issued under the new Section 10.17 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979:

- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Extended Operations) Order 2020;
- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Health Service Facilities) Order 2020;
- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Temporary Workers Accommodation) Order 2020;
- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Construction work days) Order 2020;
- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Takeaway food and beverages) Order 2020; and
- Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Infrastructure Construction Work Days) Order 2020.

#### Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Extended Operations) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development- Extended Operations) Order 2020 was made on 25 March 2020. The order allows for retail premises such as supermarkets, pharmacies and corner stores to operate 24 hours per day. This provides retailers the flexibility to adjust and extend their hours of operation to ensure that the community has easy access to food, medical supplies and essential household goods. The order also allows for waste disposal from retail premises at any time. Retailers that are part of hotels and motels are now also able to provide food and beverages 24 hours per day to people using their accommodation to consume in their rooms. All other conditions still apply, and when operating outside the usual hours of operation, retailers must take steps to reduce noise. The order also allows home businesses to operate 24 hours per day and to employ more than two people other than the permanent residents of the dwelling, but not more than five people, providing they can abide by social distancing rules. All other conditions still apply, and home businesses must take steps to ensure that they have no adverse impact on the amenity of the neighbourhood including noise, smell, fumes or waste products. Both these measures will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures.

#### Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Health Service Facilities) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development- Health Service Facilities) Order 2020 was made on 31 March 2020. The order provides flexibility to Health Infrastructure to construct or install a temporary health facility structure or a temporary alteration or addition to a building on any land owned by a public authority. The order also allows construction on development for the purposes of a health services facility to occur 24/7. These measures will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures.

#### Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Temporary Workers Accommodation) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development- Temporary Workers Accommodation) Order 2020 was made on 31 March 2020. The order allows for the immediate construction of two temporary workers' accommodation sites on land adjacent to Bayswater and Liddell power stations. To secure the State's power supply, the accommodation will be used as a refuge from COVID-19 for workers of these two key power stations during the pandemic. This order will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures.

#### Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Construction work days) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Construction work days) Order 2020 was made on 31 March 2020. The order allows weekday construction site operating hours to be extended to weekends and public holidays to ensure workers can practice social distancing without a loss of productivity or jobs. Construction sites must take all feasible and reasonable measures to minimise noise and noisy works like rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving or similar activities are not permitted on weekends and public holidays. This order will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures. Compliance with this Order will be closely monitored and reviewed if there any adverse impacts on the community or from a public health perspective.

Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Takeaway food and beverages) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development- Takeaway food and beverages) Order 2020 was made on 31 March 2020. The order allows food trucks to operate on any land at any time, with the landholder's permission. It also allows 'dark kitchens' to be established in any existing commercial kitchen, such as those in community facilities, business premises, cooking schools and function centres, to allow for the preparation of food and meals to be delivered to those at home, in self isolation, or working on the frontline. All other conditions including not obstructing vehicle or pedestrian access and taking steps to reduce noise still apply, and operators must ensure employees and customers practice social distancing. This order will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures.

Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Infrastructure Construction Work Days) Order 2020

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID-19 Development - Construction Work Days) Order 2020 was made on 31 March 2020, allowing commercial development to be carried out on weekends and public holidays as long as work was limited to weekday hours and doesn't involve high noise generating works. The Environmental Planning and Assessment (COVID Development - Infrastructure Construction Work Days) Order 2020 was made on 8 April 2020 and extended these new weekend and public holidays construction work day hours to include public infrastructure projects. Allowing development to be carried out on weekends and public holidays ensures workers can practice social distancing without a loss of productivity or jobs on construction projects. Construction sites must take all feasible and reasonable measures to minimise noise and noisy works like rock breaking, rock hammering, sheet piling, pile driving or similar activities are not permitted on weekends and public holidays. This order will be in place until the crisis is over, or another order is made amending these measures. Compliance with this Order will be closely monitored and reviewed if there any adverse impacts on the community or from a public health perspective.
