- * 9236 CUSTOMER SERVICE AND DIGITAL GOVERNMENT—DATA CENTRE ELECTRICITY USAGE—The Hon. Mark Latham to ask the Minister for Finance, and Minister for Employee Relations representing the Minister for Customer Service and Digital Government—
 - (1) What instructions have been issued to the Government data centres at Silverwater and Unanderra to reduce their electricity usage?
 - (a) What is the purpose of any such directive?
 - (2) With the inevitable rise in temperatures in the data centres from reduced air conditioning in summer:
 - (a) What impact will this have on the data machinery?
 - (b) What impact will this have on the warranty arrangements?

Answer-

(1) The Department of Customer Service recently wrote to Government Data Centre (GovDC) tenants advising them that the maximum cold aisle temperature would be increasing from 24 to 25 degrees and increasing the acceptable humidity range.

This will ultimately result in reduced power consumption by the cooling systems at the data centres, increasing the sustainability of the sites.

- (a) The ultimate purpose of the directive is to reduce the power consumption of the data centre cooling systems and thus making the sites more energy efficient.
- (2) The data centres are designed to maintain a constant temperature range of between 21.5 to 24 degrees all year round, independent on the outside temperature. The lower set point is used when free air cooling is utilised and the higher set point is used when mechanical cooling is used.
 - (a) NSW Government Data Centre tenants are experienced managers of their environments and are supportive of the increase in temperature and humidity.

There is no expected impact of this slight temperature change on the data centres ICT equipment.

Modern ICT equipment is designed to run and operate at higher input air temperatures. The American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) are an internationally recognised organisation for temperature ranges relating to data centres and ICT equipment.

The change in temperature is well within the ASHRAE standard for operating enterprise servers and storage products.

- (b) No impact is expected as input temperatures will remain within the ASHRAE standards for data centre cooling which are adopted by ICT equipment manufacturers.
