- 2564 EMERGENCY SERVICES—FIRE AND RESCUE STAFF STOOD DOWN DURING COVID—The Hon. John Ruddick to ask the Special Minister of State, Minister for Roads, Minister for the Arts, Minister for Music and the Night-time Economy, and Minister for Jobs and Tourism representing the Minister for Customer Service and Digital Government, Minister for Emergency Services, and Minister for Youth Justice—
 - (1) During the COVID-19 pandemic when frontline firefighting staff were desperately needed to fill an already short-staffed workforce, Fire and Rescue NSW took the dramatic step to stand down any employee who sensibly and courageously refused to undergo mandatory vaccination with experimental COVID-19 vaccines that have since been withdrawn due to dangerous side effects. What portion of Fire and Rescue NSW's over \$90 million dollar budget blowout, born by New South Wales taxpayers during the 2021-2022 Financial Year, was a direct result of standing down these staff?
 - (a) Will these staff received an apology by way of letter or backpay for the 22 months they were suspended?
- 2565 ENVIRONMENT—MALONEY'S BEACH—The Hon. Mark Banasiak to ask the Minister for Climate Change, Minister for Energy, Minister for the Environment, and Minister for Heritage—
 - (1) What appropriation was used by the National Parks and Wildlife Service in closing off the existing track located south of the carpark on council land as part of the Murramarang South Coast Walk project at Maloney's Beach?
 - (2) Noting the cost of additional works in closing the track was "covered" by the National Parks and Wildlife Service, is it normal practice for the National Parks and Wildlife Service or its contractors to undertake 'in-kind' works on land owned by other entities, such as Council, without the need for remuneration?
 - (a) When works of this nature are proposed, what consultation is undertaken, with the public or otherwise?
 - (i) Who is responsible for this consultation?
 - (3) What due diligence is undertaken by the National Parks and Wildlife Service to ensure all reasonable public planning considerations are discharged by the entity requesting the subject works, before commencement?

- (4) The now removed vehicle access was an essential emergency escape route in the event of a catastrophic fire, as was utilised for this purpose during the 2019 fire event. Did the National Parks and Wildlife Service formulate any feasibility studies, risk assessments or other viability reports before having their contractors restrict vehicle access?
- 2566 WATER—MALPAS DAM—The Hon. Aileen MacDonald to ask the Minister for Water, Minister for Housing, Minister for Homelessness, Minister for Mental Health, Minister for Youth, and Minister for the North Coast—
 - (1) Are you aware of the Malpas Dam to the southeast of Guyra and to the north of Armidale in the Northern Tablelands of New South Wales?
 - (2) Are you aware that one of the worst droughts on record threatened water supplies in the region and Guyra Dam was on track to run out of water in mid-2019?
 - (3) Have you given any consideration to raising the walls of the Malpas Dams to help prevent water shortages in the future?
 - (4) Given there was no allocation of money in the recent State Budget for such a project, would you consider allocating funds to raise the dam to prevent potentially catastrophic shortages in the future?
 - (5) Would it assist you to know the previous Coalition Government considered the raising of the dam such a vital priority that it pledged \$27 million in the 2022-2023 Budget to withstand future droughts?
 - (6) Do you have any intention to deliver long-term water security to the region?
