*7335 MINISTERIAL OVERSIGHT IN NEWCASTLE PUBLIC TRANSPORT REORGANISATION—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) How much oversight did the Minister have in the reorganisation of Newcastle's bus and ferry network by private operator Keolis Downer?
- (2) Was there a framework in place to ensure that services catering to vulnerable members of the community, such as the elderly, people living with disabilities and school-aged children, would be adequate to need?

Answer—

I am advised:

(1) Newcastle Transport designed the new network in accordance with Transport for NSW's Integrated Service Planning Guidelines – Outer Metropolitan Area, June 2016. The network design was also supported by historical empirical data.

(2) Newcastle Transport has developed an Accessible Transport Action Plan. This plan outlines the short-term and long-term actions Keolis Downer will take to create an accessible, all-inclusive and passenger focused public transport network; in compliance with the Disability Discrimination Act 1992, the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW), the Disability Inclusion Act 2014 and the Guidelines for Disability Action Planning by NSW Government Agencies.

*7336 RETURN AND EARN REVERSE VENDING MACHINE AT JESMOND—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for the Environment, Minister for Local Government, and Minister for Heritage—

- (1) How many deposits have been made at the Jesmond Return and Earn reverse vending machine (as at 6 February 2018)?
 - (a) What is the combined value of these deposits?

Answer—

I am advised:

(1) 1,858,175 deposited containers have been made at the Jesmond Return and Earn reverse vending machine to date.

- (a) The combined value of deposited containers made at Jesmond reverse vending machine is approximately \$185,817.50

*7337 ORANGE HEALTH SERVICE CAR PARK—Mr Philip Donato asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

- (1) When will construction commence on the announced 161-space car park at the Orange Health Service?
- (2) When will the planned car park be completed and available for use by the community of the Orange district and hospital staff?

Answer—

Pending final approval from Office of Environmental Heritage, construction is expected to begin around mid-2018.

*7338 RETURN AND EARN MOUNT HUTTON—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for the Environment, Minister for Local Government, and Minister for Heritage—

- (1) How often is the Mount Hutton Container Deposit Scheme collection point emptied?
- (2) On which dates has the Mount Hutton Container Deposit Scheme collection point been emptied to date (as at 6 February 2017)?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Mount Hutton Collection Point is emptied 3 times daily.

*7339 ADAMSTOWN LEVEL CROSSING—Ms Jodie Harrison asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) When will the Inner Newcastle City Traffic Study be published?
 (2) What efforts are being made to ease congestion at the Adamstown level rail crossing while the study is being finalised?

Answer—

I am advised

This is a matter for the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight

*7340 MOTOR VEHICLES USED AT ROSE BAY POLICE STATION—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

- (1) Are police at Rose Bay Police Station using or benefiting from motor vehicles including BMW and Jaguar vehicles provided as gifts or loans by non-police bodies or individuals or have they done so in the last 12 months (to 6 February 2018)?
 (a) If so:
 (i) Is this practice covered by any policy?
 (i) If so, where is it available?
 (ii) Who approved this practice?
 (iii) Is a benefit given to those who are providing the vehicles?
 (i) If so, what?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Eastern Suburbs Police Area Command (PAC) has a Toyota Camry Hybrid, supplied by Waverley Council. This vehicle is used as a whole of PAC resource.

The NSWPF Sponsorship, Donation and Fundraising Policy and Endorsement Policy are available on the NSWPF website.

*7341 FUNDING TO THE LAW AND JUSTICE FOUNDATION—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—

What steps will you take to provide funding to the Law and Justice Foundation to sustain the Foundation's effective level of operation?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Law and Justice Foundation (the Foundation) receives significant funding from the Public Purpose Fund (PPF) as the beneficiary of discretionary payments. The Foundation received \$1.38 million from the PPF in the 2016-17 financial year, which represented 73 per cent of the Foundation's total operating revenue for that year.

The Department of Justice and the Law Society of NSW jointly commissioned a review of the PPF in 2017. The Department is considering the Steering Committee's recommendations and submissions received from stakeholders to ensure that the PPF is sustainable and payments can continue to be made to support access to justice initiatives in New South Wales.

*7342 REVIEW OF THE SUSPECT TARGETING MANAGEMENT PLAN—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

Will the Law Enforcement Conduct Commission be asked to conduct a comprehensive review of the Suspect Targeting Management Plan as recommended by a report prepared for the Youth Justice Coalition entitled 'Policing Young People In NSW'?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Law Enforcement Conduct Commission (LECC) is an independent entity. The decision to investigate matters is therefore at the discretion of the LECC.

*7343 OPERATION OF THE LIVERPOOL AMBULANCE FACILITY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

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- (1) Considering your response to LA Q6747, did you tell the Liverpool Champion as recorded on 22 November 2017, that the facility began operating only one week previously?
(a) If so, why?

Answer—

I toured the new operational facility at Liverpool on 20 November 2017, and journalists from several news and print outlets were in attendance including the Liverpool Champion.

As already noted in LA Q6747, the Liverpool Superstation began operations on 16 August 2017 following a carefully managed and meticulously planned operational commissioning period.

- *7344 WESTERN SYDNEY RAIL NEEDS SCOPING STUDY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) When will the Western Sydney Rail Needs Scoping Study be:
(a) Completed?
(b) Publicly released?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Western Sydney Rail Needs Scoping Study Outcomes Report is available on the Transport for NSW website.

- *7345 COURT COMPLEX IN SOUTH WEST SYDNEY—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—

What is your response to the Law Society's call for a development of a substantial court complex in South West Sydney?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Department of Justice is developing a series of long term infrastructure strategies to guide the development of justice facilities and the expansion of justice services in identified priority growth areas across New South Wales.

- *7346 RADAR SPEED CHECKS CONDUCTED BY PRIVATE CONTRACTORS—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

- (1) What arrangements have been made with private contractors conducting radar speed checks to guarantee the privacy of those whose speed is checked?
(2) Does the private contractor conducting radar speed checks convey information about the vehicles whose speed is checked to any person or organisation other than the police or Roads and Maritime Services?

Answer—

I am advised:

A confidentiality agreement is in place between Roads and Maritime Services and its service providers as part of the contract for radar speed checks.

Neither the vendors' systems nor personnel have access to any fine or registration information.

- *7347 BENEFICIARY OF THE PUBLIC PURPOSE FUND—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Attorney General—

Why will you not agree to the Law and Justice Foundation becoming a new discretionary beneficiary of the Public Purpose Fund?

Answer—

I am advised:

The Law and Justice Foundation is already a discretionary beneficiary of the Public Purpose Fund.

- *7348 LAND EAST OF PARK ROAD, LIVERPOOL—Mr Paul Lynch asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

- (1) Does Roads and Maritime Services or any agency within your portfolio own or has owned within the last 2 years (to 6 February 2018), land immediately adjacent to and generally to the east of Park Road, Liverpool?
(a) If so, is the land currently for sale?

(i) If so, why?

Answer—

I am advised:

Roads and Maritime Services own the land at Lot 1 DP 380815, which is located at the intersection of Park Road and Elizabeth Drive, Liverpool.

The land is not currently for sale.

*7349 SCHOOL BUS SERVICES IN THE NEWCASTLE AREA—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) How many school bus services in the Newcastle area were cancelled or otherwise did not arrive at schools they were scheduled to service in each financial year from 2014-15 to 2016-17?
- (2) How many students ride dedicated school buses in Newcastle daily?
- (3) In the event of a cancelled school service or when a service does not arrive, what procedures are in place to ensure students get home safely?

Answer—

I am advised:

- (1) One in the period 2014-15 to 2016-17.
- (2) On an average day approximately 1,800 students tap onto a dedicated school service with a School Opal card in Newcastle and eastern Lake Macquarie.
- (3) Newcastle Transport's operations centre monitors school bus services. Schools are contacted if buses are more than 15 minutes late. Schools have also been provided with a direct number to contact the Newcastle Transport operations team, if they experience any issues with dedicated school services.

*7350 PROCEDURES FOR CANCELLED SCHOOL BUS SERVICES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Education—

What procedures are in place for schools to ensure the safety of students in the event of a cancelled school bus service or when a bus service does not arrive for any reason?

Answer—

I'm advised in circumstances where a bus service is cancelled or does not arrive for any reason the school principal will ensure that appropriate supervision is available, alternative travel arrangements are in place as far as possible, and that parents are advised of the circumstances.

*7351 CONSULTATION PROCESS FOR THE NEWCASTLE BUS ROUTES AND TIMETABLES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

- (1) What was the consultation process undertaken during the reorganisation of Newcastle bus routes and timetables?
 - (a) How many people were engaged in the process?
- (2) What steps were taken to engage with the broader community and gauge their needs?

Answer—

I am advised:

(1) Newcastle Transport proactively invited community input into the new network via the Voice of Newcastle engagement program, Social Pinpoint, social media (Facebook), direct mail and face-to-face at the Newcastle Transport Hub from 1 July 2017 to 11 September 2017.

(a) The community consultation program was designed to engage with as many people in the community as possible.

More than 600 submissions were received during this consultation process.

(2) A citizen panel was also involved in detailed planning to help refine the network and to help Newcastle Transport meet and respond to the community's needs and views.

This feedback was reviewed by the Newcastle Transport network planning team to help shape the Newcastle Transport network.

*7352 OPERATION OF BERESFIELD POLICE STATION—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

- (1) Will the new District Command, which will merge the Central Hunter and Port Stephens Local Area

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Commands, change operations at the Beresfield Police Station?

(2) Will opening hours be extended, cut back or stay the same?

Answer—

I am advised:

There is no change to the current working arrangements at Beresfield police station in terms of hours or staffing numbers.

*7353 NEWCASTLE BUS COMMUTER COMPLAINTS—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for Transport and Infrastructure—

(1) How many complaints has Transport for NSW received from commuters in Newcastle about the bus network since July 2017 (to 6 February 2018)?

(2) What processes are in place to address the complaints of commuters?

Answer—

I am advised:

All feedback and complaints are handled by Newcastle Transport in accordance with the Transport for NSW Customer Complaints Policy. Newcastle Transport will consider all customer feedback as part of its review of the new network and will make further adjustments as patronage and customer feedback is understood.

*7354 ADDITIONAL RETURN AND EARN COLLECTION POINTS—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Minister for the Environment, Minister for Local Government, and Minister for Heritage—

Are there any plans to open more Return and Earn collection points in the Wallsend electorate?

Answer—

I am advised:

The network operator, TOMRA Cleanaway, is responsible for determining the location of collection points.

*7355 REGIONAL SPORTS INFRASTRUCTURE GRANT ELIGIBILITY—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for Regional New South Wales, Minister for Skills, and Minister for Small Business—

What criteria are used to determine if a local government area is eligible for Regional Sports Infrastructure Grants?

Answer—

Agencies can consider different factors when classifying local government areas depending on the policy objectives of a program and the needs of the New South Wales community as a whole. Information on the Regional Sports Infrastructure Fund eligibility criteria is publicly available on the NSW Office of Sport website at <https://sport.nsw.gov.au/clubs/grants/regional-sports-infrastructure>.

*7356 LAKE MACQUARIE CITY COUNCIL ELECTION PENALTY NOTICES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Premier—

(1) How many registered voters who failed to vote in the 2016 Lake Macquarie City Council elections received 'Failure to Vote' penalty notices?

(2) How many voters appealed the fines due to not knowing the elections were on in their local government area?

(a) How many of these voters were successful with their appeals?

(b) How many of these voters were unsuccessful with their appeals?

Answer—

As you are aware, voting in local government elections is compulsory for New South Wales electors.

Electors who fail to vote in New South Wales elections, without valid reason, will be issued with a penalty notice by the independent Electoral Commission.

*7357 NEWCASTLE CITY COUNCIL ELECTIONS PENALTY NOTICES—Ms Sonia Hornery asked the Premier—

(1) How many registered voters who failed to vote in the 2017 Newcastle City Council elections received 'Failure to Vote' penalty notices?

- (2) How many voters appealed the fines due to not knowing the elections were on in their local government area?
- How many of these voters were successful with their appeals?
 - How many of these voters were unsuccessful with their appeals?

Answer—

As you are aware, voting in local government elections is compulsory for New South Wales electors.

Electors who fail to vote in New South Wales elections, without valid reason, will be issued with a penalty notice by the independent Electoral Commission.

*7358 COAL INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Treasurer, and Minister for Industrial Relations—

- Can a person be employed as casual under the National Employment Standards and the Black Coal Award when they work 52.36 hours per week and have a permanent set 4 panel roster, working 12.5 hour shifts, including day and night shifts, weekends and public holidays, in an open cut mine?
- Can an enterprise agreement be approved without the Fair Work Commission checking the enterprise agreement and applying the Better Off Overall Test and not checking the documents and information in the submitted documents as to it being truthful and factual?
- Can an enterprise agreement be less than the Black Coal Award, and can the agreement allow casual employment in production and engineering when the Black Coal Award does not allow casual employment in production and engineering as ruled by a full bench hearing?
- Can an employer refuse to pay accident pay, as per an agreement and the mining industry standard?

Answer—

New South Wales referred its industrial relations powers to the Commonwealth in January 2010. Any enquiries regarding the National Employment Standard and modern awards should be directed to the Commonwealth's Fair Work Ombudsman.

*7359 FINES ISSUED AT HEAVY VEHICLE SAFETY STATIONS—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

- How many heavy vehicle drivers have been issued with speeding fines as a result of inspection of their recent driving log/history at the Mount White Heavy Vehicle Safety Station in each financial year from 2010-11 to 2016-17?
- How many heavy vehicle drivers have been issued with speeding fines as a result of inspection of their recent driving log/history at the Twelve Mile Creek Heavy Vehicle Safety Station in each financial year from 2010-11 to 2016-17?

Answer—

I am advised:

The NSW Police Force (NSWPF) does not issue speeding fines from log book inspections. Roads and Maritime Services is responsible for enforcement action in relation to log book inspections.

*7360 ILLUMINATED SPEED SIGNS ON M1—Mr Clayton Barr asked the Minister for Finance, Services and Property—

How many motorists have been issued with infringement notices after being recorded by the speed camera located just south of the illuminated 100 kilometres per hour speed limit signs on the M1 at Bar Point since its installation in 2006 (to 21 December 2017)?

Answer—

- 3,722.

Notes:

1. Data at 14 February 2018. Report includes penalty notices with an offence date between 1 January 2006 and 21 December 2017. Data may change retrospectively as matters progress through the fines lifecycle.

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*7361 REGISTRATION COSTS FOR PEOPLE WITH A DISABILITY—Ms Sophie Cotsis asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

- (1) How many modified vehicles for people with disabilities are currently registered in each electorate in New South Wales (as at 23 November 2017)?
- (2) How many modified vehicles for drivers in wheelchairs are currently registered in each electorate in New South Wales (as at 23 November 2017)?
- (3) Does the Roads and Maritime Services require any additional annual registration inspections for these vehicles?
 - (a) If so, what additional annual inspections are required and what is the cost of these inspections?
- (4) Are any additional fees and charges for registration levied on vehicles modified for drivers with a disability?
- (5) Are any additional fees and charges for registration levied on vehicles modified for drivers in wheelchairs?
- (6) Are drivers with a disability charged any additional fees or charges to obtain a licence?
 - (a) If so, what is the current level of these fees and charges (as at 23 November 2017)?
- (7) Do drivers with a newly acquired disability face any additional fees or charges to retain their licence?
 - (a) If so, what is the current level of these fees and charges (as at 23 November 2017)?

Answer—

I am advised:

Roads and Maritime Services' systems do not record the reason for vehicle modifications.

Information relating to licencing and registration is available on the Roads and Maritime Services website.

7362 WEST CAMPSIE BYPASS—Ms Sophie Cotsis to ask the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

*7363 PROPOSED SYDENHAM TO BANKSTOWN CORRIDOR STRATEGY—Mr Jihad Dib asked the Minister for Health, and Minister for Medical Research—

What plans are in place to expand the Canterbury and Bankstown hospitals in relation to the proposed Sydenham to Bankstown Corridor Strategy?

Answer—

Local Health Districts undertake comprehensive service planning, which takes into account population growth and ageing as well as current and future demand for health services.

Capital investment is considered as part of the usual NSW Budget processes.

*7364 SHARING OF WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS—Mr Philip Donato asked the Minister for Family and Community Services, Minister for Social Housing, and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault—

Will consideration be given to sharing the results of Working with Children checks across multiple agencies with the applicant's permission to avoid expense and duplication?

Answer—

I am advised that Working with Children checks (WWCC) are valid for five years, and that an employee is not required to apply for a new WWCC within that five year period even if they change employer.

*7365 IMPROVING SYDNEY'S NIGHT TIME ECONOMY—Mr Alex Greenwich asked the Minister for Planning, Minister for Housing, and Special Minister for State representing the Minister for Resources, Minister for Energy and Utilities, Minister for Arts, Vice-President of the Executive Council—

- (1) What is the progress of the platform for key data sets relating to Sydney's night time economy to support decisions and service delivery, identified as a supportable item in the Government's response to the Sydney Night-Time Economy Roundtable?
- (2) What data will be identified in this platform?
- (3) Will this platform be publicly available?
 - (a) If so, where?
 - (b) If not, why not?
- (4) What is the progress of the 11 action items in the City of Sydney Live Music and Performance Action Plan 2014 that require State action to remove barriers and complexities for venues hosting

live music and performance as identified in the Government's response to the Sydney Night-Time Economy Roundtable?

- (5) What action has occurred outside the Sydney Night Time Economy Task Force on these action items?
- (6) As part of this process, what recommendations have been made to Government on these action items?

Answer—

I am advised:

(1) Action 2.2 of the New South Wales Government Response to the Sydney Night Time Economy (NTE) Roundtable Action Plan (the Response) supports establishing a central data repository to inform planning and decision making in relation to the NTE.

Implementation of this action is being led by the NSW Data Analytics Centre (DAC) which is represented on the NTE Taskforce. The DAC has prepared a proof of concept which proposes timelines, costs for data sets, methodology and scope. The DAC is consulting with the Taskforce to refine this proof of concept.

(2) The repository will include relevant data sets from Taskforce agencies, and relevant publicly available data sets. It will include economic, visitor, regulatory, transport, crime and health data.

(3) The repository is intended to inform the work of the Government and assist in the creation of a vibrant, safe and diverse night-time economy in the Sydney CBD, Oxford Street and Kings Cross entertainment precincts. Selected data that complies with New South Wales and Commonwealth privacy laws, and the Government's Open Data Policy, may be made available for public use.

(4) The 11 action items in the City of Sydney's Live Music and Performance Action Plan that require State Government action are being progressed as part of the work being undertaken by the Sydney Night-time Economy Taskforce.

This includes: investigating options for planning reforms that will make it easier to activate places and spaces; investigating the potential for better coordination of the liquor and planning processes; progressing work that will result in greater standardisation of licence conditions which can be appropriately applied across the various licensed venue types; increasing the maximum patron capacity for small bars from 60 to 100; commencing a trial of later lockouts and last drinks for live entertainment venues in the Sydney CBD, Oxford Street and Kings Cross precincts; and investigating options to improve the regulation of noise from live music and performance premises.

(5) Create NSW is working with Taskforce agencies, including City of Sydney, as well as industry and other relevant government agencies to investigate planning reforms and entertainment noise regulation to support live music and performance. The NTE Taskforce is regularly updated on the progress of these actions.

(6) Advice on the 11 actions is provided to the Government as part of broader reporting by the Taskforce on the progress of actions in the Government's Response to the Sydney NTE Roundtable Action Plan.

*7366 JETTY LICENCES—Mr David Harris asked the Minister for Lands and Forestry, and Minister for Racing—

- (1) How many jetty licences are located in Chittaway Creek?
(a) How much revenue was collected in each year from 2012 to 2016?

Answer—

- (1) Nil.
(a) Not applicable.

*7367 CARBON DIOXIDE EMISSIONS—Mr Paul Scully asked the Minister for Roads, Maritime and Freight—

What is the average level of carbon dioxide emissions per hour of a passenger vehicle operating in New South Wales?

Answer—

I am advised:

Vehicle emissions are regulated by the Commonwealth Government.

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*7368 PENALTY NOTICES ISSUED FOR FAILURE TO WEAR LIFE JACKETS—Mr Guy Zangari asked the Minister for Police, and Minister for Emergency Services—

- (1) Since the introduction of the mandatory life jacket trial for rock fishers in the Randwick City Local Government Area (LGA) on 1 December 2016, how many penalty notices have been issued for failing to wear an appropriate life jacket while rock fishing in this LGA (to 22 November 2017)?
- (2) How many penalty notices were issued for children failing to wear an appropriate life jacket while rock fishing in this LGA (to 22 November 2017)?

Answer—

I am advised:

As publicly announced when the Rock Fishing Safety Act commenced, the Government has implemented a moratorium on the issuing of fines while the trial is underway. Enforcement officers from Randwick City Council, National Parks and Wildlife Service, DPI Fisheries and NSW Police Force have instead been issuing warnings and providing rock fishing safety advice to rock fishers in Randwick not wearing a life jacket.

*7369 DAPTO CONNECTED LEARNING CENTRE—Ms Anna Watson asked the Minister for Tourism and Major Events, and Assistant Minister for Skills—

- (1) How many people have visited the Dapto Connected Learning Centre since 1 January 2017 (as at 23 November 2017)?
- (2) What services were offered to these individuals?

Answer—
