		These reporting requirements are in addition to requirements under the <i>Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979</i> requiring the Department to be provided with an annual report outlining relevant operational information.
3	That any recurrent government grants to approved charitable organisations be accompanied by greater rigour and oversight, including clear reporting obligations. In 2024, the NSW Government delivered the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Amendments (Transparency and Fit and Proper Persons) Act 2024 to improve oversight of ACOs in their law enforcement role. The changes made by this Act included clarifying that ACOs are subject to the requirements of the Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009 and ensuring ACOs are subject to an external complaints mechanism via the NSW Ombudsman.
5	That, as part of its review of the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979, the NSW Government consider ways to improve efficiency, reduce complexity and clarify responsibilities to support approved charitable organisations' enforcement role under the Act.
