Cost of issuing a planning certificate:

- Planning certificates range in complexity, for example where development is more recent and certificate attributes current, issuing of planning certificates may be straightforward.
- Issuing of Planning certificates, regardless of complexity, requires involvement of three levels of staff a
 planning support officer, planner and senior planner and varies between an average of 15 minutes per
 officer for basic/straightforward planning certificates and up to 40 minutes per officer for more complex
 planning certificates.
- Complexity is driven by the constraints on land (bushfire or flood prone or conservation and heritage areas) and the majority of planning certificates issued in the Clarence Valley are more complex approx. 70%.
- Certificate attribution maintenance is conducted monthly on approximately 200 certificates adding \$9.81 to the cost of each certificate (28hrs x Grade 12 planner).
- The average cost of issuing an Planning Certificate in the Clarence Valley is \$111.88 excluding staff overheads.
