## PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE TO EXAMINE THE PREVALENCE, CAUSES AND IMPACTS OF LONELINESS IN NSW

## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE 16 AUGUST 2024

The NSW Legislative Council's Standing Committee on Social Issues has launched an inquiry into the prevalence, causes, and impacts of loneliness in NSW. The inquiry was referred to the committee by the Hon Rose Jackson MLC, Minister for Water, Housing, Mental Health, Youth, Homelessness and Minister for the North Coast.

Committee Chair, the Hon Dr Sarah Kaine MLC, stated:

'This inquiry will examine the extent of loneliness and social isolation in NSW, including how it is measured and opportunities for improved data capture. The committee will consider populations at risk of loneliness and social isolation and look at the psychological and physiological impacts on certain groups in the community, including young people, the elderly, those living with disabilities, regional residents, and the bereaved'.

Dr Kaine continued: 'The inquiry will also evaluate existing initiatives by government and non-government organisations to mitigate loneliness and social isolation, as well as policies and initiatives in other jurisdictions that address loneliness as a public health issue'.

In addition, the inquiry will:

- explore steps the State Government can take to reduce the prevalence and impacts of loneliness in the community
- examine the role of community, technology and social media companies, organisations, and individuals in mitigating the impact of loneliness on individuals and society
- consider the financial costs of loneliness to the economy and measures that be implemented to reduce this.
