The Commission's Wellbeing Survey was conducted by consultants Review Partners to understand how people in NSW are finding different parts of their lives. The survey has been run for 4 years and is the Commission's only current primary source of data on the wellbeing and experiences of the people of New South Wales. The insights from the survey can be used to guide and develop strategic directions, areas of advocacy and highlight the experience of different groups in NSW. Findings from the 2024 survey was based on a sample size of more than 2,000 responses with data collected between March and April 2024. Recruitment of survey respondents was conducted through an online marketing panel. The survey data was weighted using the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) census data to control for certain demographic factors. To ensure anonymity and accuracy, any group with fewer than 30 respondents was excluded from the analysis as small sample sizes may not accurately represent the wider population due to outliers.
