A report by the Secretary of the Premier's Department or Secretary of The Cabinet Office is to be prepared after consultation with the Public Service Commissioner and the senior Minister to whom the relevant Department is responsible (clause 52(2) of the GSE Rules). A report under clause 52(1) of the GSE Rules is not required in certain circumstances, including:

• if the person is being re-appointed as the Secretary of a Department; or

• if the person was the Secretary of another Department at the time of the appointment or within 3 months before the appointment.

Under Premier's Memorandum M2021-07 Appointments to NSW Government boards and committees, all Ministerial appointments to NSW Government boards and committees are required to follow the Public Service Commissioner's Appointment Standards: Boards and Committees in the NSW Public Sector.

Under the Appointment Standards, appointments to NSW Government boards and committees are required to demonstrate compliance with four general principles, namely merit, fairness, diversity and integrity.
