Response:

The current suite of tourism funding (state or federal programs) inhibits local government/ small communities from applying – eligibility is limited and all too often funding is aimed at regional tourism initiatives not local initiatives and eligibility via co-contribution is too prohibitive for small rural councils. Therefore council will shift its focus to capitalising on its strengths.

The burden of maintaining and access to current tourism infrastructure investment and management of related operations is mostly with limited council funding and budgets(VICs, council owned caravan parks etc) – and quite often the ongoing viability and operations of such tourism investments by councils is questionable (by the elected members).

Special rate variations are not a solution to support local tourism initiatives.

Also please note in transcript page 8 Ms Barlow... (line 6) Aboriginal keeping **phase** should be Aboriginal Keeping **Place**.
