The Hunter REZ, and I assume other REZ's in NSW, were selected without community consultation; the current Federal Government have been critical of the Dutton Opposition's selection of potential nuclear power stations, without consulting the residents of those localities. This is surely an exercise in HYPOCRACY by the current Federal Labor Government.

Despite media hype suggesting that RURAL residents, generally, are welcoming these renewable developments into their areas, nothing could be further from the truth. Yes, there are those who either haven't YET been impacted by a renewable development, or/and those who are to HOST those developments, and receive compensation. In other words, people VALUE and give a VERY HIGH PRIORITY to the AMBIENCE of the area in which they choose to live. Those "authorities" pushing the further development of "renewables" in rural areas are refusing to acknowledge the significance of AMENITY.

Other adverse consequences of REZ's, particularly "wind farms" is the compromised ability for aerial fire-fighting support in those areas, especially as many of these developments are in hilly/mountainous terrain which is difficult to access from the ground.

It is also apparent that local wildlife (koalas/ wedgetail eagles /etc) are having their importance downgraded to a lower level , in favour of these developments .

As it currently stands , the hosts of these developments receive the benefits , whilst those who have to endue them receive little or nothing . Furthermore , any VPA payments made to Councils in relation to these developments , should be to the benefit of those residents immediately affected , and not to other areas of the Council LGA .
