Safe were amazing and even let our daughter name the kittens when we surrendered them into their care, and we followed their progress on their website as they were desexed and eventually all found loving homes thanks to Safe.

Safe asked for nothing from us when they agreed to take the kittens, but we were happy to make a donation to their service as we were so very grateful for their help.

We tried multiple Vets and Rescues before we found Safe Animal Rehoming, and every one was full, and couldn't accept any more cats, and without Safe I don't know what we would have done except surrender them to the pound to be euthanized. As a pet loving family, this option was totally abhorrent, but with no one else available to help us, it would have been our only option.

Please speak to the Rescues directly and hear their stories, as once a cat is desexed the cycle is broken with no more unchecked breeding which is imperative especially if the cat is an abandoned cat, street cat, community cat, part of a colony, semi owned or unowned. Thank you
