INQUIRY INTO 2024 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE NET ZERO COMMISSION

Dear Committee Members,

The first report of the NSW Net Zero Commission (NZC) clearly and shockingly shows that NSW is not on track to meet any legislated emissions reduction targets, in part because of the "sizeable pipeline" of more than 17 coal mine extensions and applications in this state. This is extremely concerning and irresponsible when the planet is now experiencing for the first time 1.5 degrees of warming and extremes of weather with associated natural disasters becoming far more common across the globe. I highly recommend the following: The NSW Government should request a specific, dedicated report from the NZC on the risks that coal and gas expansions pose to NSW climate targets, to be completed by June 2025.

The report should include advice on a coal sectoral target to drive emissions reduction in the coal sector.

In the meantime, approvals of new coal expansions should be paused until such advice has been provided by the NZC.

The Net Zero Commission should be asked to provide specific advice and make recommendations on all proposed major coal mine expansions in NSW, as per s15 (3) of the NSW Climate Change (Net Zero Future) Act 2023 .

A Regulation should be created under the Climate Change (Net Zero Future) Act 2023 to place a duty on key planning decision-makers to meet the 2030 and 2035 climate change targets and restrict downstream emissions.
